Strength:

- A team of qualified faculty members committed to providing quality education to the learners and working untiringly for the holistic development of the students, most of whom come from underprivileged section of the society.
- Conduction of fair online admission of students done on merit basis.
- Internal Assessments, Class Tests, Project Reports, Extempore, Paper Presentation, invited lectures by renowned persons, Field Work and Study Tours are a regular feature of the teaching, learning and evaluation process.
- Emphasis is laid on co-curricular activities and various outreach programmes conducted by Student Support and Progression Committee and NSS Unit of the College throughout the year infusing in the students a sense of responsibility and accountability to the society at large.
- A computer laboratory, ICT-enabled classrooms, departmental Staff Rooms backed with computers, projectors and printers along with a newly renovated Seminar Room are definitely a strength for the institution.
- The Central Library is fully automated with INFLIBNET and OPAC facility.
- The entire College Campus along with the Hostel is under CCTV surveillance.
- Office administration is fully automated and a team of Non-teaching staff is constantly working for the benefit of the stakeholders.
- An active Career Counseling Cell provides necessary career guidance to the students by inviting different organizations having expertise in the respective fields.
- ICC actively working for generating awareness on gender discrimination and gender sensitization programmes are held for the faculty and the students.
- The College acts upon the feedback from students and parents.
- In keeping with the vision and mission of the institution, the stakeholders are working with dedication for a better future for the students.

Weaknesses:

- Lack of financial assistance from UGC poses an impediment to the infrastructural development of the institution.
- Construction of separate building and renovation of the existing one cannot be done due to lack of sufficient fund.
- Smooth execution of academic and administrative activities is affected due to insufficient support staff. Posts of Non-teaching staff are lying vacant for years as Government approval is required.

- Creation of new Teaching posts is not possible without Government sanction and approval.
- In spite of best efforts, new Courses cannot be introduced without approval from the competent authority.
- Attendance of the students is not up to the mark since most of them come to the College from remote areas.
- Library needs to procure more books but financial grant is not available for purchasing books.
- Job-oriented and skill-oriented courses cannot be introduced due to infrastructural weaknesses.
- Number of classrooms with ICT facilities is inadequate. Separate rooms for Add-on Certificate Courses cannot be allotted due to dearth of space.
- Due to lack of full-time support staff, teachers are sometimes overburdened with both academic and administrative work, thereby affecting the teaching-learning process.

Opportunities:

- The institution being the only Women's College in the district, aims at providing quality education to the girls of the neighbouring localities, most of whom come from underprivileged section of the society.
- The eco-friendly atmosphere of the College with a safe and secure environment and student-friendly teachers and support staff definitely provide an opportunity to the students for higher studies.
- Students are provided with career guidance through the various programmes organized by the Career Counseling Cell.
- Job opportunities for the needy students and placement may be possible once the job oriented and skill-based courses are opened with approval from the competent authority.
- Faculty exchange programmes will be initiated to encounter the inadequacy of teaching staff.
- Installation of solar panel in the coming year and Sajal Dhara Prakolpo are an addition to the existing facilities.
- Students are facilitated with a vast reading room to enrich their knowledge. Expansion of library and procurement of more books are in the purview of the college management.
- The institution is expected to have a sanction of grant for purchase of books, equipment and renovation of the building in the coming financial year.

Challenges:

- To introduce other subjects of study and various job-oriented and skill-oriented courses.
- To make the girls overcome their financial and other hindrances and make them prepared for higher studies.

- Expansion of infrastructural set-up.
- To explore the potential of the students and make them more class-oriented.
- To receive fund for construction of building, an auditorium and expansion of library.
- To have necessary approval of filling up vacant Non-teaching posts.
- To seek approval of creation of new teaching posts for several departments of the College.
- To meet the challenges of New Education Policy to be introduced in the 2023-2024 Academic Session.
- To motivate the teachers to get engaged in research work and find financial help for various project works.
- To work tirelessly and relentlessly to make the institution a Centre of Excellence.

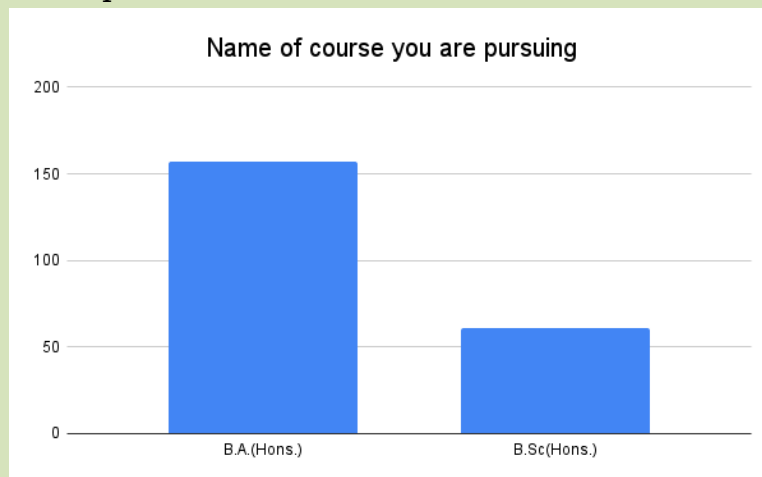

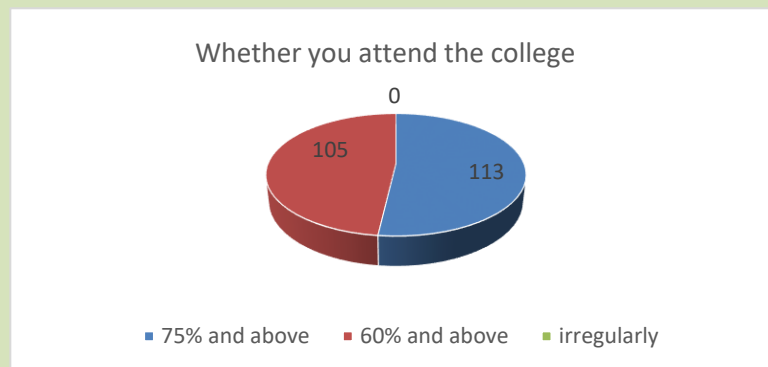

Students' Feedback Analysis 2022-23 Krishnagar Women's College

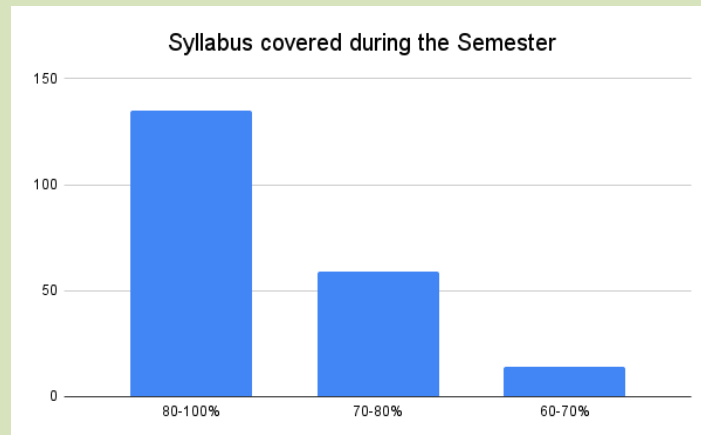

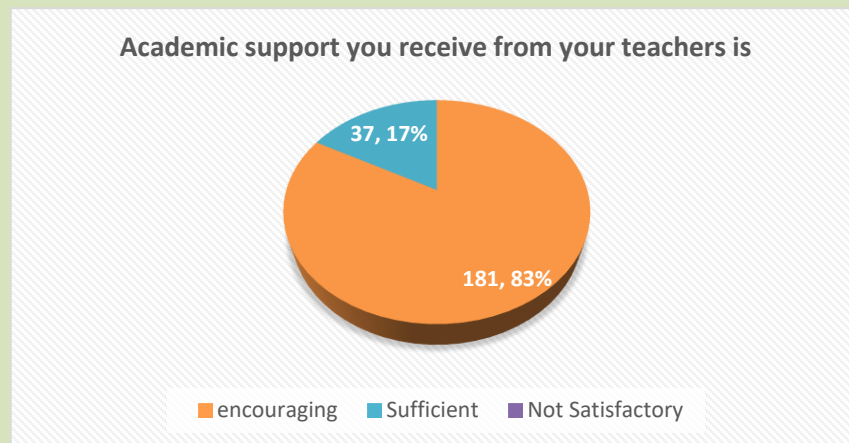
Observation: It is found that among them 157 from B.A (Hons.) students and remaining 67 are B.Sc (Hons).



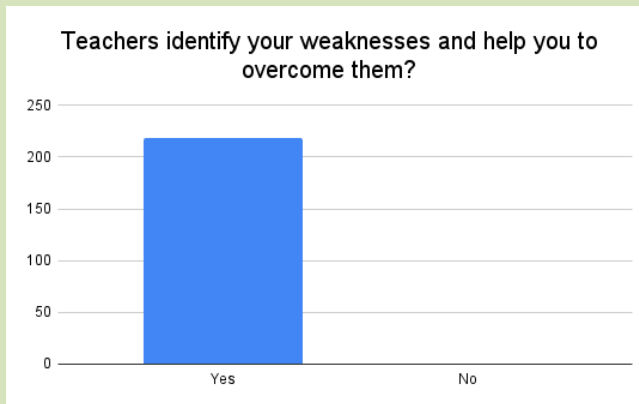
Observation: This is a comparative analysis on students attending classes. The result shows that 113 students attended classes 75-100%, 105 students attended classes 60-75%.



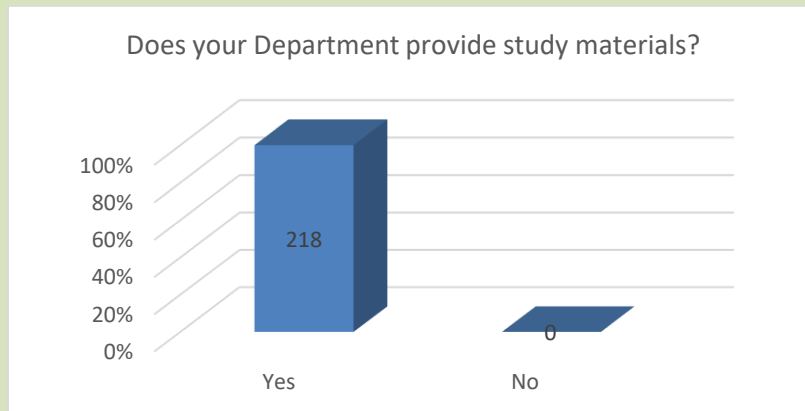

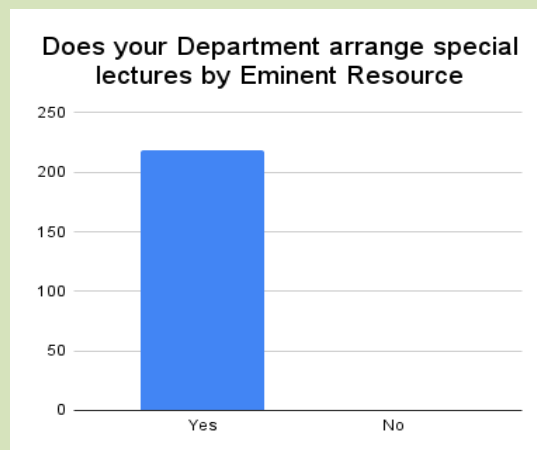

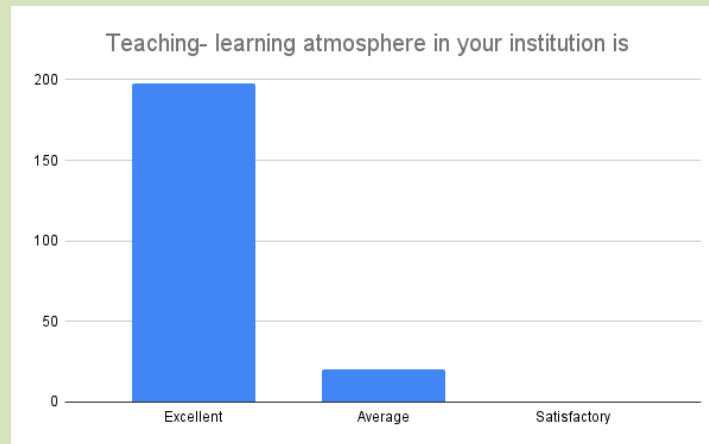
Observation: The result shows that all participants agreed that their teachers identify their problems and help them to overcome problems.



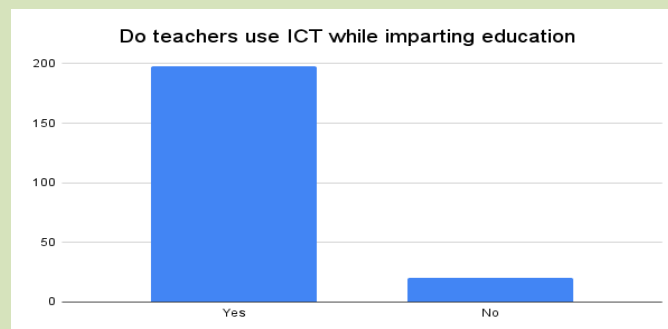
Observation: The result shows that all participants agreed that their departments provide study materials on regular basis.



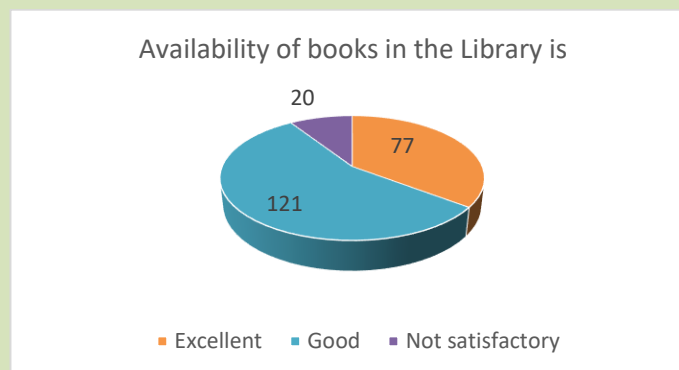
Observation: The result shows that all participants agreed that their departments arrange special lectures of eminent resource persons on regular basis.



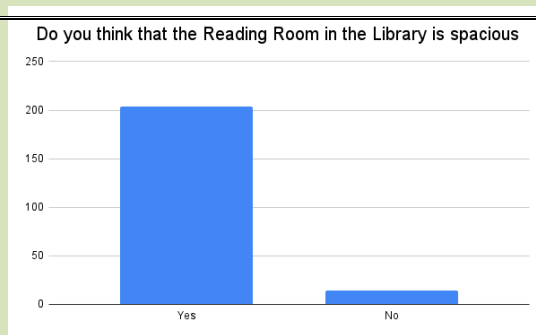

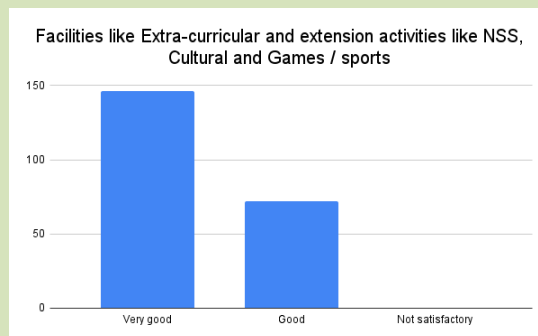
Observation: The graphic result shows that out of 218 students 198 students agreed that teachers use ICT while imparting education; whereas 20 students responded it negatively.



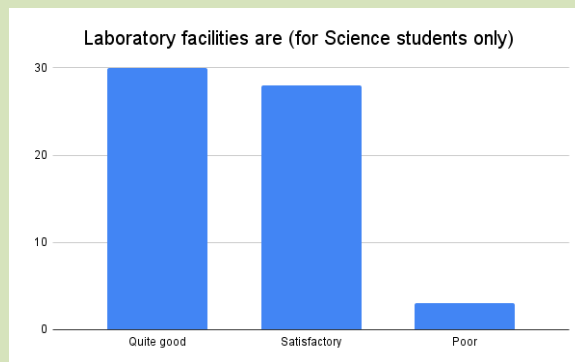
Observation: The graphic result shows that 77 students responded that availability of books in the library is excellent. 121 responded it as good and remaining 20 students responded it as not satisfactory.



Observation: The graphic result shows that out of 218 students 204 students agreed that the reading Room in the Library is spacious; whereas 14 students responded it negatively.



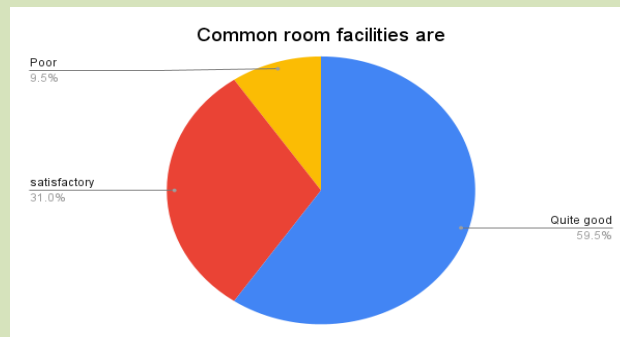

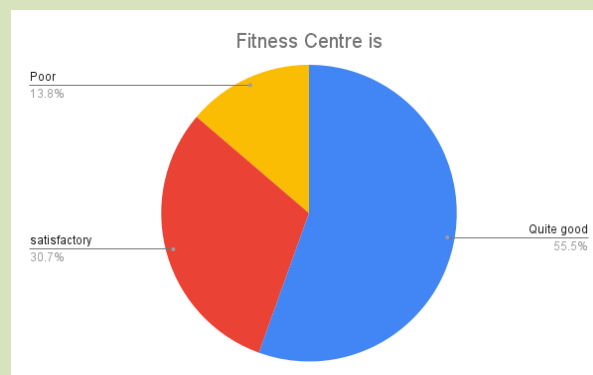

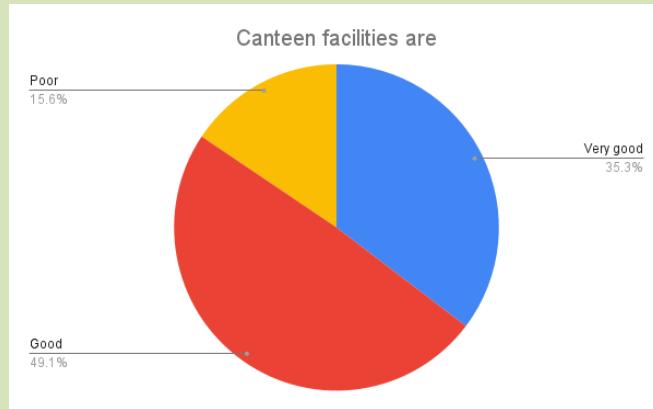

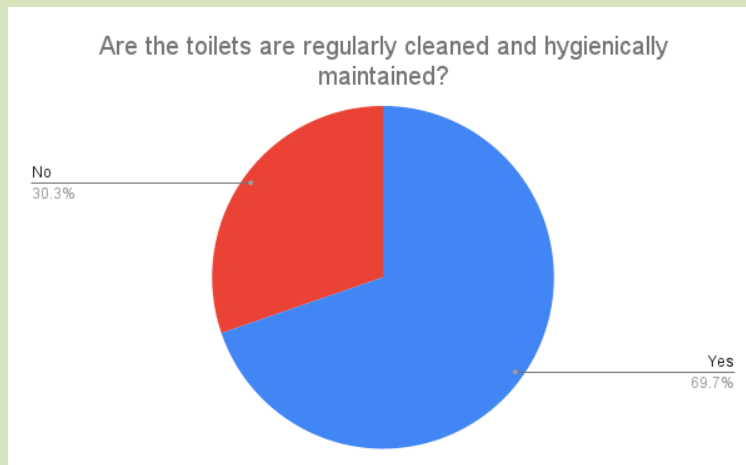

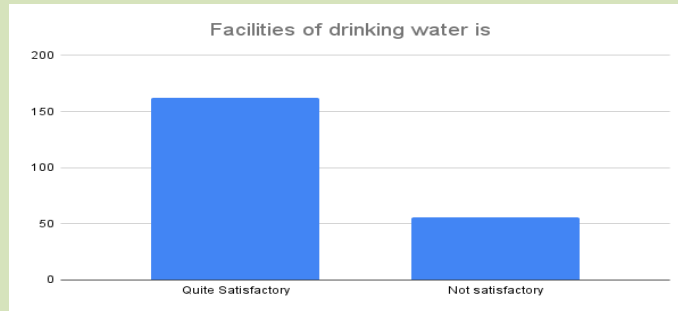

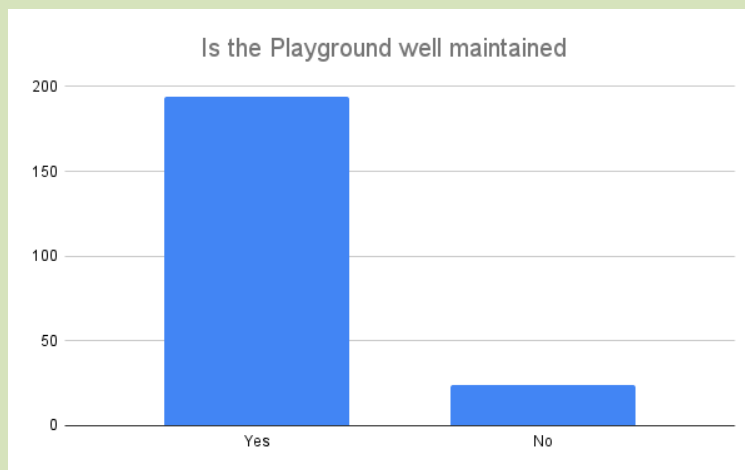
Observation: The above pie chart result shows that 77 students agreed that common room facilities in the college are very good; whereas 107 and 34 students responded it as good and poor respectively.



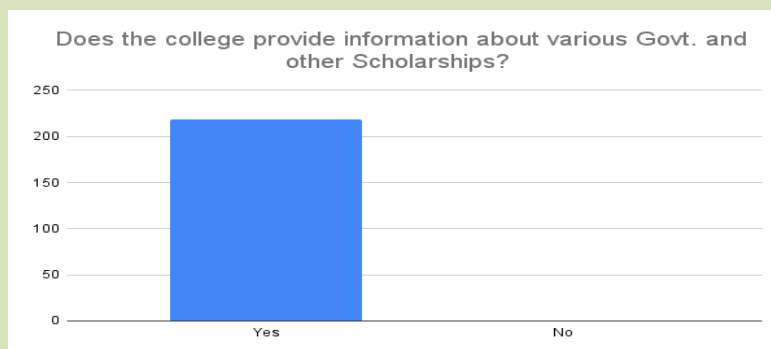
Observation: The result shows that out of 218 students 152 students agreed that the toilets are regularly cleaned and hygienically maintained; whereas 66 students responded it negatively.



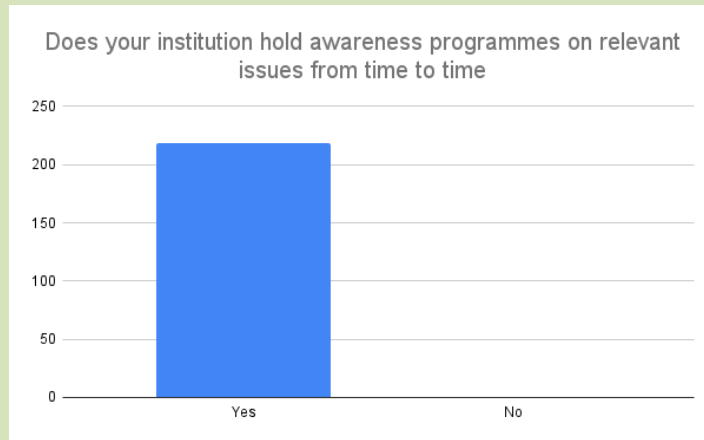
Observation: The result shows that out of 218 students 162 students agreed that the facility drinking water is quite satisfactory; whereas 56 students responded it negatively.



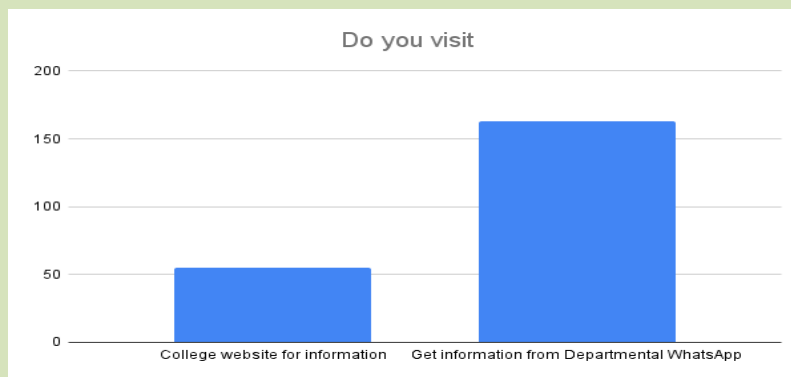
Observation: The result shows that out of 218 students 194 students agreed that the playground is well maintained; whereas 24 students responded it negatively.



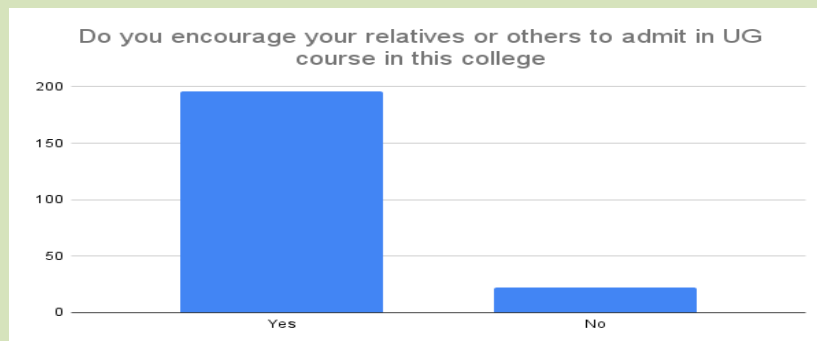
Observation: The result shows that all participants agreed that the college provide information about various Govt. and other Scholarships on regular basis.

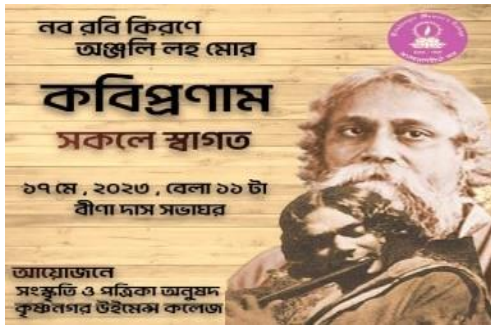

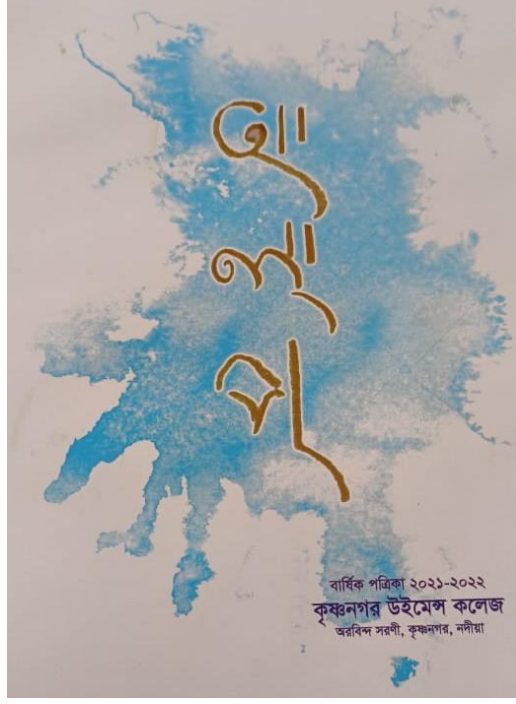
Report on International Mother Language Day

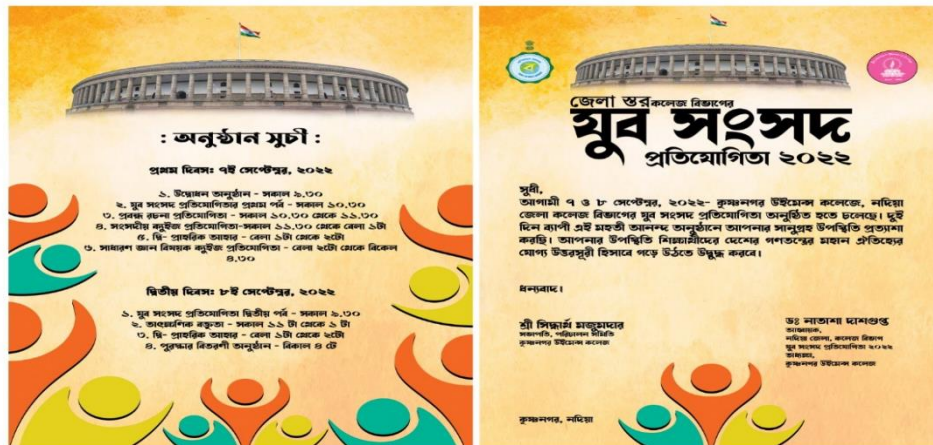

Date: 04.12.2022 to 09.12.2022

Introduction:

The field survey cum excursion to Kalimpong and surroundings, West Bengal, conducted by Department of Geography of Krishnagar Women's College with 5th Semester Hons. and Program students, from 04.12.2022 to 09.12.2022. The field survey cum excursion aimed to provide students with practical exposure and hands-on experience in primary data collection and preparation of field report for the partial fulfilment of their syllabus. Total 48 students and 4 faculty members participated in the excursion.

Procedure:

As the availability of train tickets for the entire student's group is a matter of concern, we had to initiate the process as early as possible. Therefore, we had discussed the place and date of visit in the department as well as with the concerned batch of students. We had consulted with travel agency. 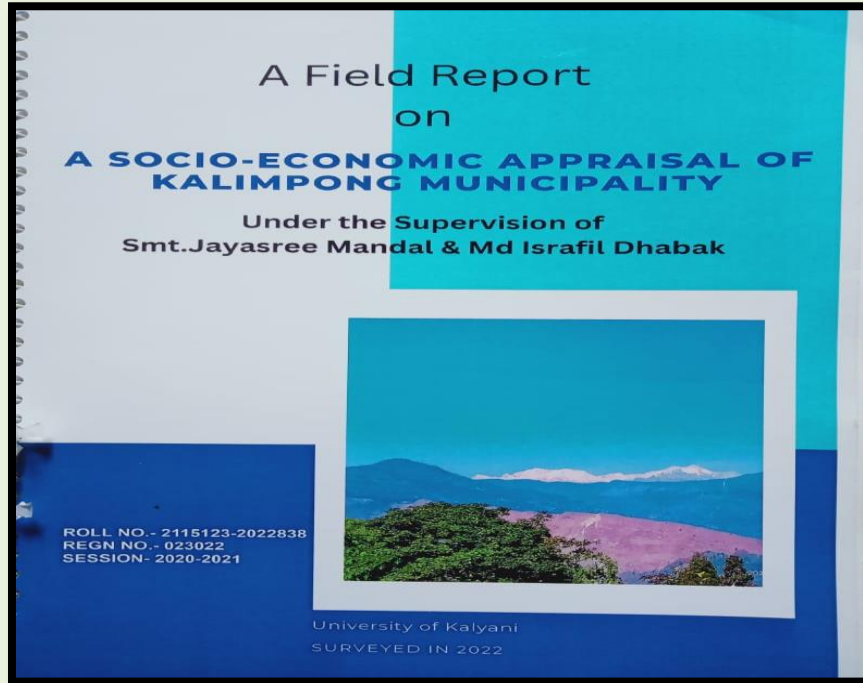

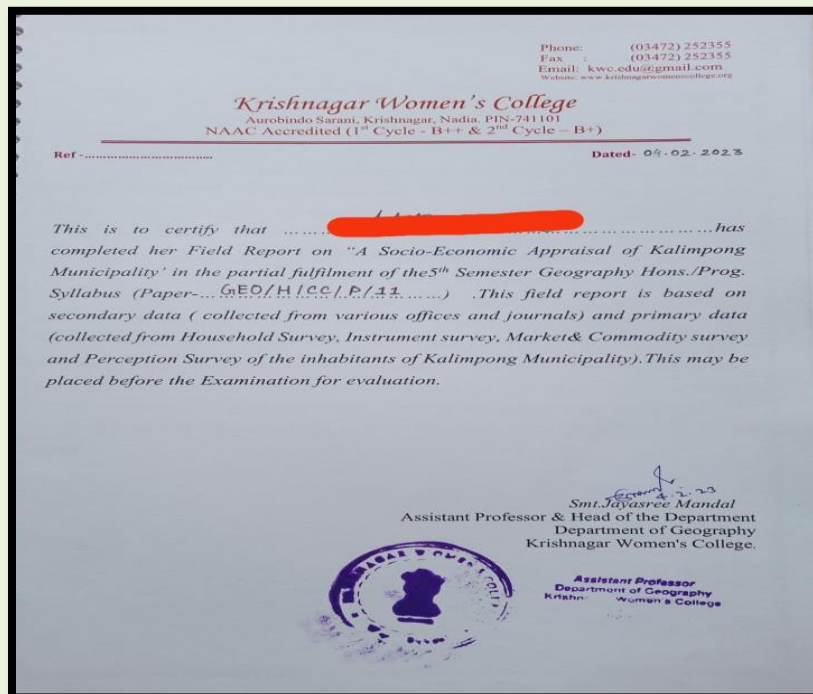

**Report on Educational Tour to Rural Water Supply (RSW) Plant, Krishnagar (9th
December, 2022)**

1. Introduction

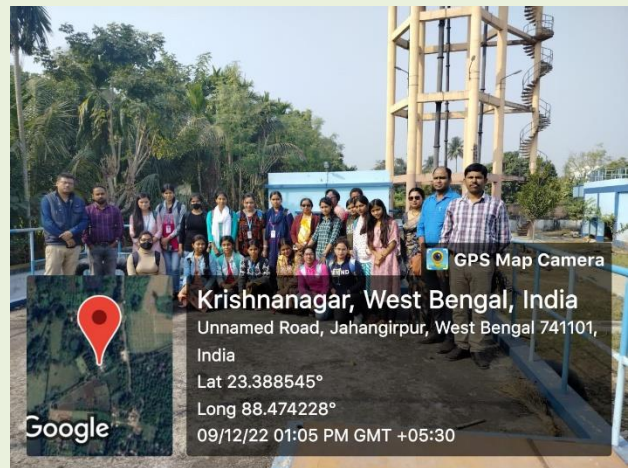


Figure: Few snap-shots of our tour with faculties, students and RWS office's staffs inside the RWS plant site

She covered all the aspects of transformational ideas on NEP 2020 in school and college education. Ensuring universal access at all levels of schooling from pre- school to 12. Ensuring quality early childhood care and education for all children between 3 – 6 years. New curriculum and pedagogical structure (5+3+5+4). She said NEP emphasized on use of mother tongue or local languages upto class V

while, recommending its continuance till class VIII and beyond. Sanskrit and foreign languages will also be given emphasis.

The salient points which have learnt from deliberations of our speakers are:

- A move towards multidisciplinary HEIs, with more emphasis on local culture and language;
- A move towards Institutional and faculty autonomy;
- Revamping of curriculum and exam patterns;
- 'Light but tight' regulation by a single regulator for HE
- Added encouragement for SEDGs
- To go beyond the four walls of the classroom and create a digital space for holistic growth.
- To increase GER from 26.3% to 50% by 2023.
- Reintroduction of 4 years multi-disciplinary bachelors program with multiple entry and exit options and the academic credits which he or she earned from various HEI will be stored in Academic Credit Bank, including credits earned from SWYAM, ODL or other online portal.
- Flexibility to institution to offer different design for Master's program.
- Massive Open Online Course (MOOC) will be given special preference. Open and Distance Learning (ODL) also will be covered under NAAC
- Examination can be replaced by comprehensive and continuous evaluation process.
- Teacher can access, create and upload digital resources in Govt. education portal.

- Discontinuation of MPhil program that create major controversy.
- For energised and capable faculty the NEP 2020 has to establish National Research Foundation (NRF), for funding research proposals through rigorous peer review, at all Universities and colleges creating beneficial linkages among government industry and researchers. Department of Science and Technology (DST) and Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR) funding agencies will also function in addition to NRF.
- Sharing internet based resources.
- Blended learning through 20-30% online education, 20% teacher student face to face learning and another 50% by direct field reality so that their job ready.
- Broadband connectivity for marginalised students.
- Integration of skilled training in the existing educational system.
- Recommendation for internship in local industry, businessman craftsman, musician etc.

Both of them highlighted the important issues with clarification and this will help us to allay our doubts and complexities. The new education policy is very exhaustive and will take some time to understand it's full content. Debate and discussion from time to time will make the issue comprehensible.

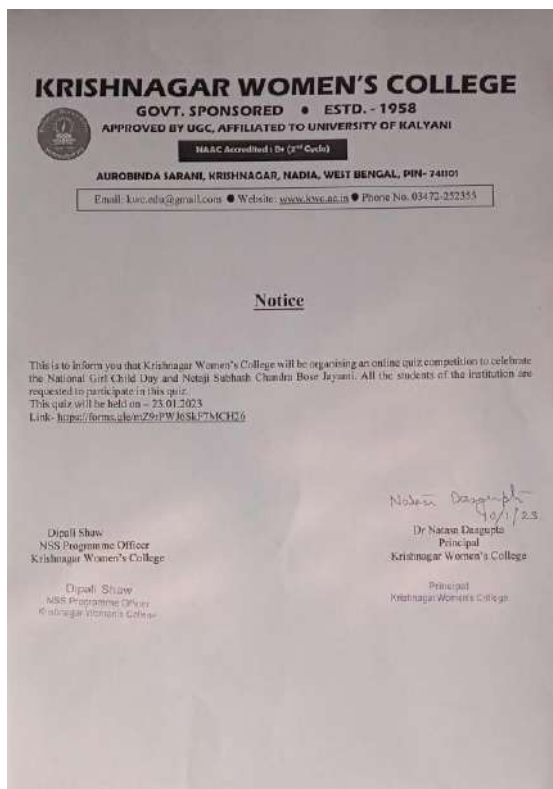
Event Details:

Report on Awareness programme on human trafficking and cross Border Trafficking Organized by NSS Unit, Krishnagar Women's College

On 6th January 2023, the NSS Unit of Krishnagar Women's College organized a seminar on awareness program on human trafficking and cross-border trafficking. The event took place at the Bina Das Memorial Hall of the college and aimed to educate the participants about the grave issue of trafficking and raise awareness about its various dimensions. The guest speaker for the event was Priyanka Malitha, the Superintendent of Police of Krishnagar.

Objectives: The main objectives of the awareness program were as follows: a) Educate participants about the nature and scope of human trafficking and cross-border trafficking. b) Create awareness about the methods used by traffickers and the vulnerabilities of potential victims. c) Inform participants about the legal frameworks and initiatives in place to combat trafficking. d) Empower participants to recognize and report instances of trafficking. e) Encourage the community to come together

and take preventive measures against trafficking.

Program Details: The program commenced at 12:00 PM with an opening address by the NSS Unit Acting Coordinator Aniruddha Bagchi, highlighting the importance of addressing the issue of human trafficking. The Coordinator then introduced the guest speaker, Superintendent Priyanka Malitha, who possesses extensive knowledge and experience in dealing with trafficking cases.

Guest Speaker Presentation: Superintendent Priyanka Malitha delivered an informative and engaging presentation on the subject matter. Her presentation covered the following key areas:

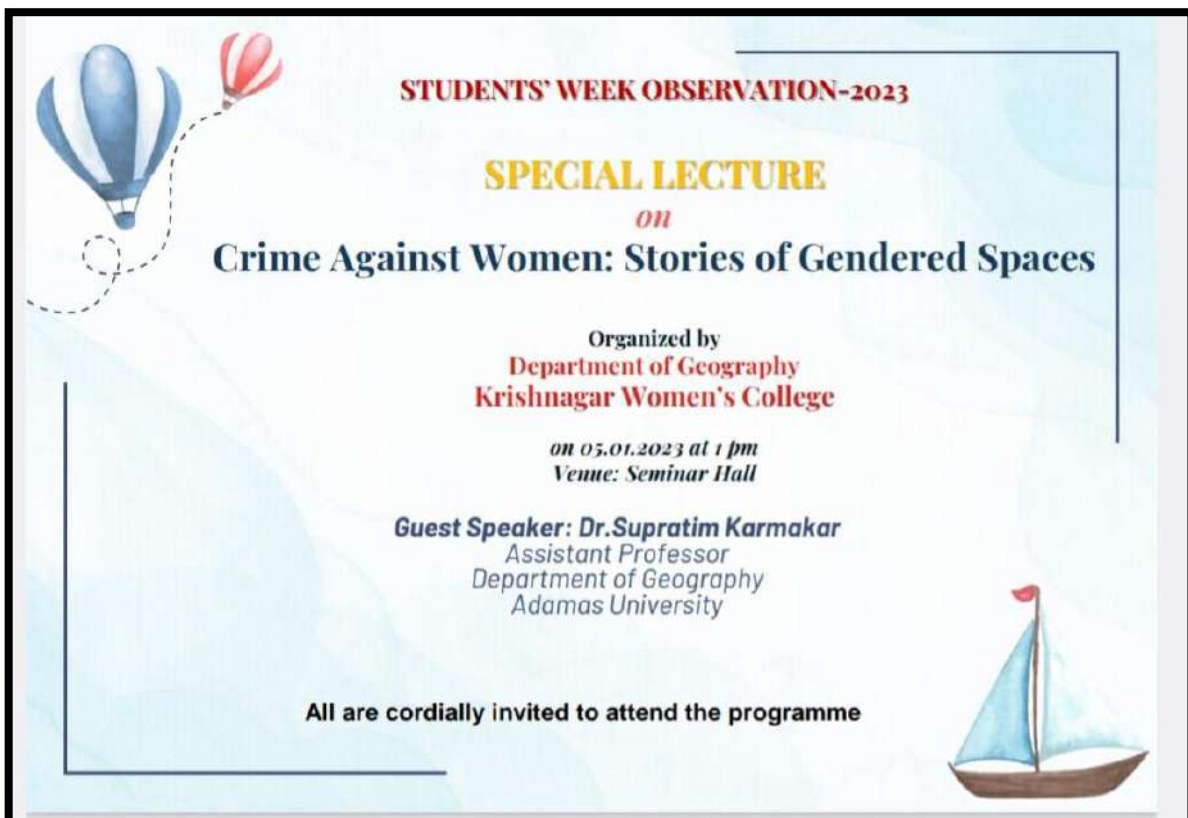

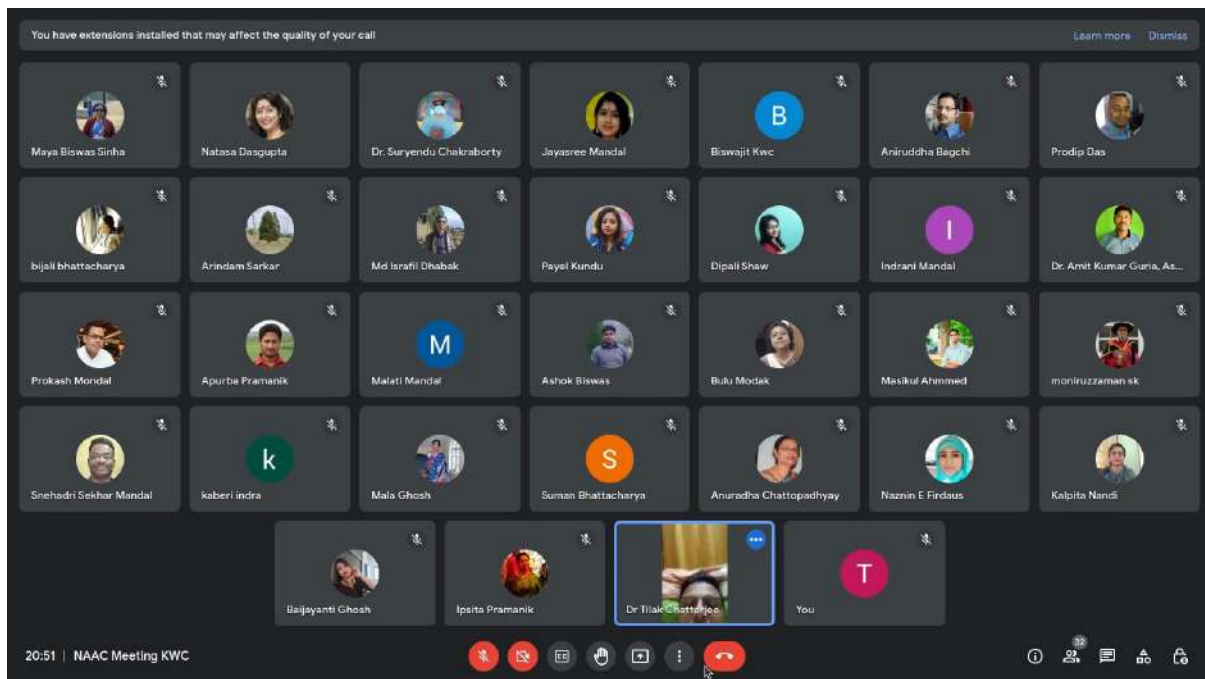


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**Report on Faculty Development Programme on

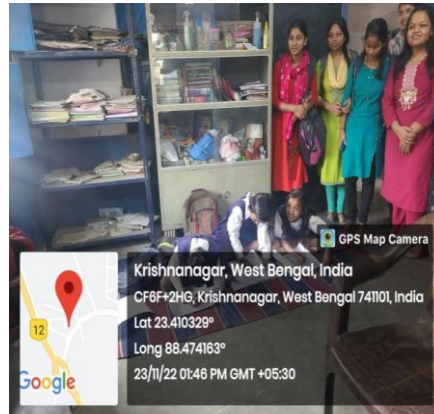

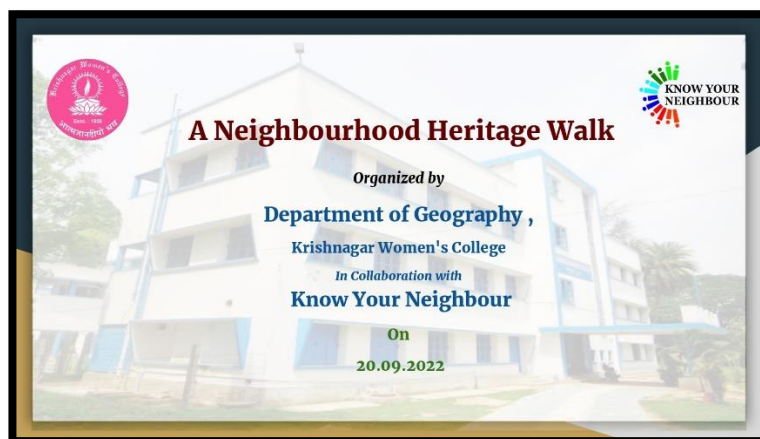

Survey Report on Panchayat Department of Political Science

Survey is an integral part of a graduate course in Political Science. To teach the students how to do a survey and how to make the survey report and subsequent inference, the Department of Political Science had organised a survey in March 2023. The theme of the survey was "KNOW YOUR NEIGHBOURS".

A team of 69 (including teachers, office staff and students of 2nd 4th and 6th semester) visited four villages near Krishnanagar. These villages were Diknagar, Bhatjangla, Dhubulia-1 Gram Panchayat and Belpukur. The visit was scheduled on 22nd and 23rd March 2023.

Approx 300 homes were visited during this survey. The students were divided into multiple groups for the survey. The students were accompanied by office staff and guided by the teachers of the Department. In each house, the residents of the house (mostly the women) were asked queries related to well-being. A pre-decided questionnaire (copy enclosed) was used for this purpose. The questions were mostly

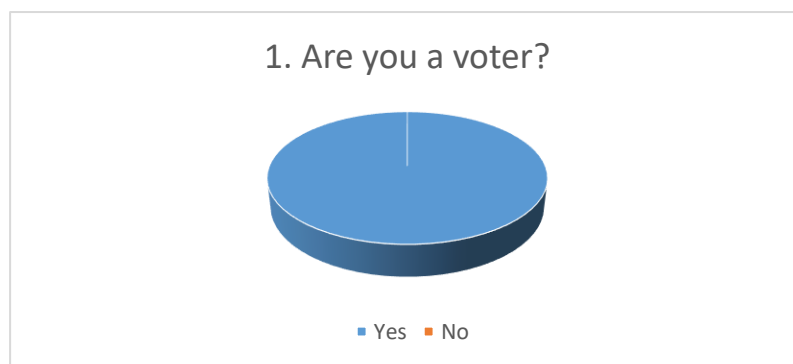
focused on health, education, water supply, habitat and environment. and feedback collected from forty six families. Each response is noted in two point scale, mainly yes or no. Question wise response patterns are presented graphically.

After the answers were received, the students were then taught about the basics of survey report preparation and data analysis.

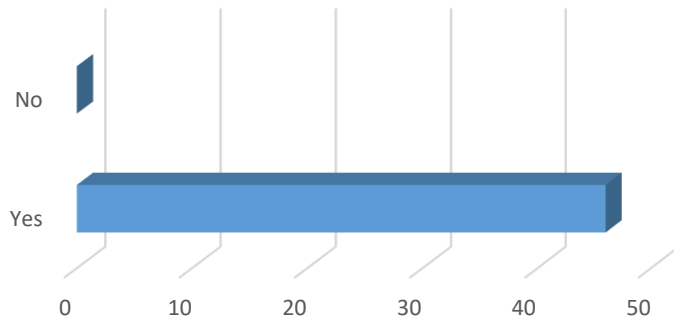
Analysis of Graphical representation:

The survey revealed the following result:-

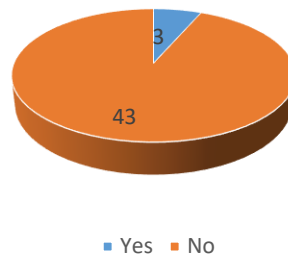
- 100% vote frequently in every election

- Only 2% is enjoying Scholarship.
- Only 2% is studying as hostelite.
- 52% have any medical condition.
- 56.5% need continuous medication.



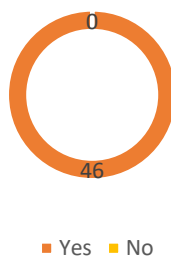

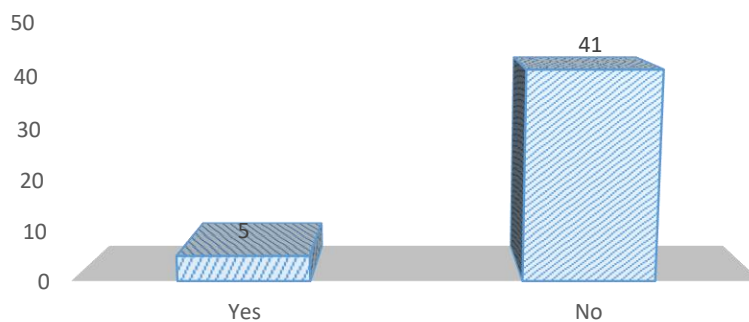
3. Do you belong to a particular political party?



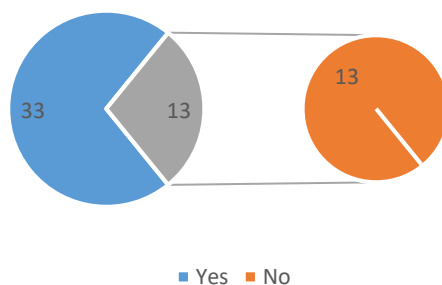

Report on National Science Day 2023

Department of Chemistry, Physics, Krishnagar Women's College

The entire program was categorized into three parts

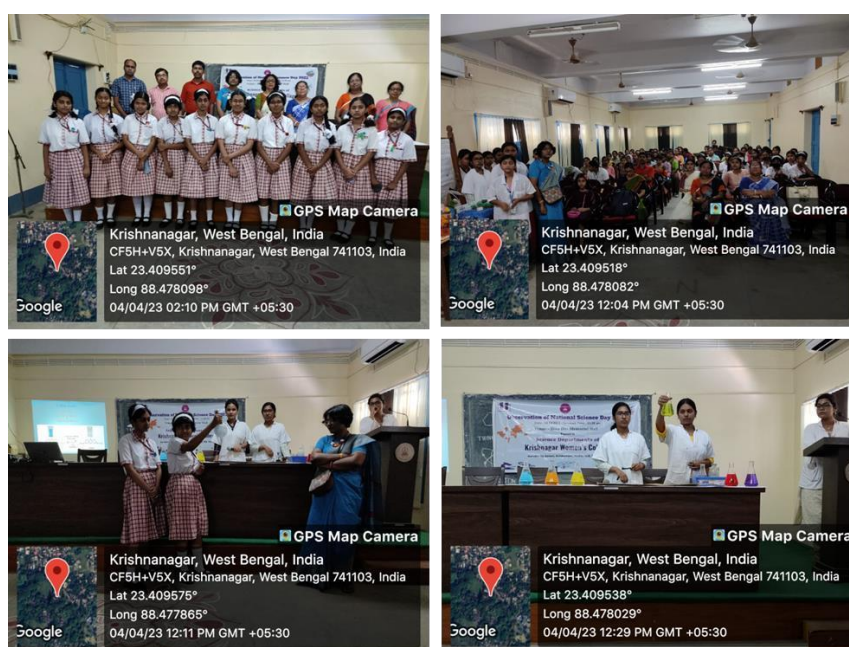
1. Practical demonstration of few fun-based chemistry experiments

The session was very thought provoking, they really enjoyed these films on contemporary issues.

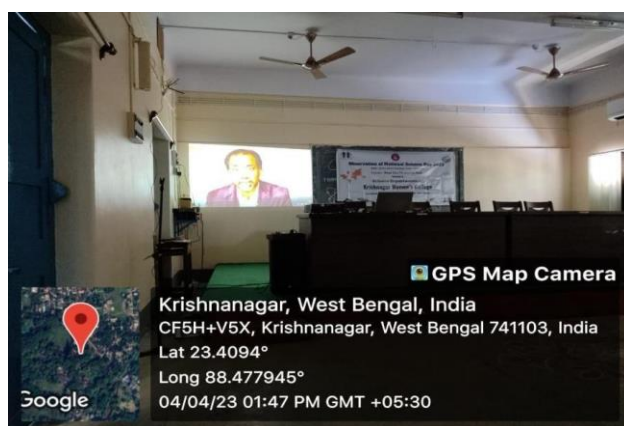


Photo: Science movie exhibition on documentary films
