NSS unit of Krishnagar Women's College Report of the Year 2021-22


1.Observation of Communal Harmony Day 22nd and 23rd November 2021





4.Clean Campus Drive 18th February 2022

Title: Campus Cleaning and Dustbin Installation Report

On 18th February 2022, a group of NSS (National Service Scheme) volunteers from Krishnagar Women's College undertook a campus cleaning initiative and installed six dustbins across the college premises.
