A Few words about our College



"Atmagyandipobava" - Be your Own Light of Knowledge

Krishnagar Women's College, founded in 1958, owes its inception to the influx of women from erstwhile East Pakistan who were in need of education after India wins back its freedom. The urge felt by the educated circle of Krishnagar led to the establishment of this one and only College for women in the district that initially started its academic journey in Krishnagar Government College and then shifted to an old building located in Basanta Chatterjee Lane. Soon, the construction of the present College building started with the financial assistance from West Bengal Government under the able leadership of its first founder Principal, Professor Dipti Bose. Since then, the College is marching forward with the sole intention to impart quality education to a cross-section of women most of whom are first-generation learners and hail from the marginalized section of society. The College was first affiliated to Calcutta University and it came under the aegis of Kalyani University in 2000. The College has been accredited by NAAC first with a grade of B++ and with a B+ in its second cycle.

The Institution has a number of infrastructural facilities to offer to the students an eco-friendly beautiful green campus of 3.9 acre in the heart of the city, dedicated teachers, 24×7 CCTV surveillance, a well-stocked automated Library with e-journals and OPAC facility, well equipped Science Laboratories, Classes with ICT tools, Computer Laboratory, Free Wi-Fi, Cheap Canteen, providing hygienic food, safe and pure drinking water, cycle stand, toilet for differently abled persons, clean Hostel for students, expansive playground and attractive sports facilities and a medicinal plant garden.



The Institution offersMajorand Minor coursesunder 4-Year UG Degree (Honours / Honours with research)Coursesin 11 (Eleven) subjectsin the faculty of Science (Chemistry, Mathematics, Physics, Geography, andEconomics), Literature(Bengali, English and Sanskrit) and Humanities & Social Sciences (History, Political Science and Philosophy) respectively. It emphasizes on regular class teaching complemented with special lectures by eminent faculty members and inter-departmental lectures throughout the year. The students can access a number of e-journals for academic purpose under the guidance of their teachers. Additionally, A variety of add-on certificate courses, Study tours, Seminars and workshops are offered to the students to add extra edge to their domain of knowledge. The College has signed MoU with some state level organization such as Webel, Student Health Home etc., also with few neighboring Colleges and associated with Kanyashree University and is engaged in various collaborative projects.

As an outcome of the discipline and regular theoretical and practical classes, class tests, the students do fairly well in university examinations, sometimes scoring highest marks in some subjects.

The college Library has more than 27,000 books. Students can also access 6293 e-Journals and 195809 e-Books under N-LIST programme of UGC-INFLIBNET. Library is fully automated by Integrated Library Management Software (ILMS) "KOHA".

To encourage students from the marginalized sections of society, various scholarships like Kanyashree, Aikyashree, Swami Vivekanada Merit cum Means and others, have been floated by the State Government and the students get all the supportive help from the dedicated staff while applying for the scholarships and Students Credit Card through online portal.



The College has a vibrant career counseling and placement cell to empower students in their journey towards career growth. The cell arranges various training programmes, mostly free of cost, to enhance communicative skill and ICT skill of the students. We also offer few regular courses for skill enhancement and capacity building of our students. Currently, we are running an app-based certificate course on communicative English offered by British Council Library. This year we have planned to introduce a certificate course on Computer offered by WEBEL. The College also maintains an online job portal to prepare students for competitive examinations. From this year we will also offer short term vocational training to our students.

Hostel is an integral part of the college. Students coming from distant parts of the district as well as from outside the district can find accommodation in the College Hostel located inside the campus at a cheap rate. It is completely safe and secure with three full time Hostel employees and other staff to take care of the boarders.



The College is committed to imparting a holistic development of the students by encouraging them to take part in various co-curricular and extension activities and their achievements in this field are recognized in the Annual Prize Distribution Ceremony. A variety of programmes organized by the Cultural and Magazine Sub-Committee, like observation of days of National and International importance are a regular feature of the institution. Publication of departmental wall magazines and College magazine helps the students to see their own writings in print for the first time.



The College believes that physical exercises, recreational activities and sports are an integral part of education. Annual sports of the college are conducted regularly. Additionally, we have planned to offer short term courses on Yoga and for self-defense from this session.



We also take care of mental and physical health of our students. They can avail free of cost treatment and medicine from Students Health Home Centre near our College. We also arrange health checkup camps in the campus on regular basis.



NSS unit of the College monitors our environment-friendly campus and provides students with the ambience necessary at a centre for teaching and learning. The NSSVolunteers are actively engaged in outreach programmes viz. adopting slum area, conducting survey in the surrounding villages, organizing seminars ,distributing essentials among the children of the adopted village and organizing a health-check up camp for them.





Ragging is strictly prohibited in the College and the hostel. Besides, College has set an Internal Complaint Committee (ICC) and Grievance Redressal Cell care where students may lodge complaint if they have any and it is addressed with extreme care.



The College has the legacy of having eminent academicians and renowned personalities at its helm to frame policy for overall academic and infrastructural development of the College. At present the College is run by a Governing Body headed by an acclaimed academician, Sri Siddhartha Majumdar, Chairperson, West Bengal School Service Commission and Associate Professor, City College, Kolkata. The Principal, Dr. Natasa Dasgupta, a renowned academician and an accomplished social personality, is empowered to implement the decisions taken by the Governing Body. Apart from the Governing Body, IQAC plays an important role in working closely with the faculties to create an effective teaching-learning environment with a view to reach the goal of the institution.

Office of the Krishnagar Women's College is equipped with the "College Automation System (C.A.S 7.1 Version)" and is aimed to provide easy, automated and hassle-free services to its students with several wings of the office.



Krishnagar Women's College, once established to cater to the need of the post - partition displaced girls is now serving as a multifaceted centre for empowerment of girls. Projects like installation of solar panel, Water ATM under Sajal Dhara Prakalpo, Rain water harvesting system and introduction of two new courses are in the pipeline. Challenges are many and in spite of that, we envisage to take this only Women's College in the district to a new era of emancipation, academic and creative excellence.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION IN DIFFERENT MAJOR/MINOR SUBJECTS:

<u>ADMISSION 2023-24</u> KRISHNAGAR WOMEN'S COLLEGE

Admission qualifications:

A candidate may be admitted to the first semester of 4 year (8 semesters) UG courses of studies on passing Higher Secondary (10 + 2) Examination in general conducted by the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education or an equivalent examination conducted by other State Board/ Council or the West Bengal Council of Rabindra Open Schooling or National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS) recognised by the Distant Education Bureau (DBE), **Subject to fulfilment of the conditions mentioned below:**

In case of other Boards/ Councils a candidate shall have to pass in five recognised subjects, of which one shall be English, of full marks not being less than 100 each. A candidate passing in less than five subjects shall not be eligible for admission.

However, candidates passing Higher Secondary examination in vocational stream conducted by the West Bengal State Council of Technical & Vocational Education and Skill Development (WBSCTVE & SD) or any other equivalent Board/ Council are also eligible for admission provided that the candidate must have passed in five recognised subjects of which one shall be English.

Candidates shall be allowed for admission within 03 (three) consecutive academic sessions including the year of passing in previous qualifying examination. (For example candidates passing H.S. Examination in the year 2021 will get last chance of admission in the academic session 2023-24.)

Merit list will be prepared and published on the basis of Index. CALCULATION OF INDEX:

Aggregate = marks obtained in top four subjects excluding the marks obtained in Compulsory Environmental Studies

Aggregate marks + Marks obtained in the Major subject/ Related Subject OR

Aggregate marks (in Best 4 subjects) + Marks obtained in English

[forthose who have not studied Major/ Related subject) in the last qualifying examination]

General Information For Admission to Honours & Programme Degree Course of Study

Reservation Of Seats: 22% seats are reserved for candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes and 6% for the candidates belonging to the Scheduled Tribes. A relaxation of marks to the extent of 25% from the marks secured by the last candidate admitted in general category would be permitted. 10% of total seats are reserved for Economically Weaker section (EWs) from this year.

For OBC category, 17% seats are reserved in which OBC-A (10%) and OBC-B (7%) seats.

In case ST candidates are not available, those seats will be offered to SC candidates and vice-versa. When both SC and ST candidates are not available, seats may be converted to general category with the permission of the competent authority.SC and ST candidates admitted with the general candidates in order of merit, however, will not get the benefit of reservation.

The candidate admitted in reserved category must produce relevant certificate issued by the competent authority.

3% of the total number of seats in each subject is reserved for physically challenged candidates. Such candidates should furnish copy of valid disability certificate, issued by the competent authority (The Handicap Board constituted by the Office of the Superintendent, District Hospital) of the district of residence, along with application without which such application will not be entertained for consideration. The percentage of disability of the candidates will only be considered while preparing the merit list of such physically disabled candidates.

Regular Facilities

❖ Library: The College boasts of a well-stocked library, fully equipped with booksto cater to the needs of the students as per the new Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) Syllabus. The College has also installed Library automation

software and in the coming days aspires to have a fully automated and digitally accessible library. The registration for N-List enables the faculty and students to have an easy access to e-books, e-journals and other electronic reading materials.



❖ Classrooms: The College boasts of well aired classrooms both in its main and apex buildings, always making the teaching learning process a favorable experience.



Laboratory Facilities

*** Mathematics Department**has a Computer Laboratory.



❖ Geography Department hasOne General Lab cum class room and one Computer Lab. Equipped with adequate no. of Instruments (89), Maps (250 approx.) and Specimens (108) are available to fulfil departmental needs.



- ❖ English department has one language laboratory equipped with Overhead Projector, LCD along with sound system and internet connection.
- ❖ Chemistry Department has three laboratories having one Organic Lab, one Inorganic, one Physical Lab, and one Store cum Balance Room.



❖ Physics Departmenthas two general laboratories along with one electronics laboratory and one optics laboratory. Total area of the laboratories is approximately 150 sq. m. The laboratories are equipped with electric

connections for doing experiments and the electronics laboratory is equipped with Computer with internet facility along with instruments.



Field Study and Excursions: To supplement curriculum and regular classroom teaching, various departments on a yearly basis organizes field study or educational tours and excursions. Such exposures help in personality development.







Hostel Accommodation/Facility

Located in the lush green area of the vast College Campus, the College provides Hostel facility for the girl students of both the College and Kanyasree University with an ambience of comfortable stay that helps students to pursue their academic career undisturbed. To get accustomed with the hostel premises, students are provided healthy meal at regular intervals, medical check-up and all other facilities. Hostel authority is also mindful for the security of the students with the engagement of 24x7 guard facility.




The Hostel, at present, accommodates 30 students on an equal basis from both the institutions. A subcommittee is entrusted with the responsibility of extending all the facilities to the boarders involving them in the various cultural activities and outreach programmes to inculcate in them a feeling of belongingness and a sense of responsibility to take care of the other boarders as well. They are made to feel that they are very much a part of the entire KWC family. The Hostel is supervised by support staff assigned by the College, including Matron, two full-time Helpers/Non-teaching staff, Security, Cooks and other employees. To ensure the security of the boarders, CC Cameras have been installed. At the time of admission to the College Hostel, the boarders will be aware about the rules and regulations of the Hostel, the seat rent, messing charges and all other related issues. The College is committed to extend all sorts of assistance despite its limited resources for the academic growth of the students who have to stay away from home for the purpose and thereby making their stay in the Hostel safe and secure, and filling them with a sense of homeliness.

ENROLMENT IN DIPLOMA IN COMPUTER APPLICATION COURSE FOR 2023-24 SESSION

Candidates admitted to Semester I under 4 year UG (Hons/Hons with research) in Krishnagar Women's College are hereby advised to take admission to self-financed Career Oriented Course offered by the college. 
Co – Curricular and extracurricular activities

- e) Apart from these, needy and meritorious students who are not financially well sounded are assisted to apply for the financial grant from The Hon'ble Chief Minister's Relief Fund.
- f) Students are also assisted to avail scholarship provided from NSP, Priyangbada Devi Birla Memorial fund, Department of Armed Forces (only to the students whose guardian serving/served in the said forces) etc.

Visiting Lectures/ Seminars/ Webinars:

To supplement the regular educational curriculum, the Departments on a daily pace organize Visiting Lectures, Seminars, Webinars and Lecture Series, where renowned faculties are roped in from across the state or country to make the students aware in recent social and scientific developments. Anti-Ragging Measures:

RAGGING


Ragging, in any form, is totally prohibited in the College premises of Krishnagar Women's College. Any student indulging in such insolent acts shall be subjected to punishment by the concerned authorities and / or a Court of Law.

WHAT IS RAGGING? "Ragging" means causing, inducing, compelling and/or forcing a Student, whether by way of a practical joke or otherwise, to do any act which detracts from human dignity, or violates her person, or to expose her to ridicule, or to forebear from doing any lawful act, by intimidating, wrongfully restraining, wrongfully confining, or injuring her, or by using criminal force upon her, or by holding out to her any threat of such intimidation, wrongful restraint, wrongful confinement, injury, or the use of criminal force.

SUPREME COURT VERDICT FOR STRINGENT ACTION IN CASE OF RAGGING:

The Honourable Supreme Court of India in its recent direction to the educational institutions pronounced that all educational institutions should obtain an UNDERTAKING from each candidate at the time of admission to the effect that, he/she is aware of the system of punishment in case of ragging to other students. And that, in case he/she is involved in any case of ragging, he / she is aware of the scale of punishments, including criminal action, cancellation of admission, expulsion from hostel, withdrawal of scholarship, imposition of fine uptoRs. 25,000/-, and / or rigorous imprisonment up to 3 (three) years, etc. All candidates and their parents / guardians, in their own interest, are advised to make themselves acquainted with the relevant rules, regulations, provisions of law, as well as decisions of various Courts of Law, including those of the Apex Court, in relation to anti-ragging measures in India.

Redressal of Grievances of Students

These regulations shall be called as the University Grants Commission (Redressal of Grievances of Students) Regulations, 2023.

Objective

To provide opportunities for redressal of certain grievances of students already enrolled in any institution, as well as those seeking admission to such institutions, and a mechanism thereto

Scope of Grievances can make by Students:

"Grievance" means, and includes, complaint(s) made by an aggrieved student in respect of the following namely:

- i. admission contrary to merit determined in accordance with the declared admission policy of the institution;
- ii. irregularity in the process under the declared admission policy of the institution;
- iii. refusal to admit in accordance with the declared admission policy of the institution:
- iv. non-publication of a prospectus by the institution, in accordance with the provisions of these regulations;
- v. publication by the institution of any information in the prospectus, which is false or misleading, and not based on facts;
- vi. withholding of, or refusal to return, any document in the form of certificates of degree, diploma or any other award or other document deposited by a student for the purpose of seeking admission in such institution, with a view to induce or compel such student to pay any fee or fees in respect of any course or program of study which such student does not intend to pursue;
- vii. demand of money in excess of that specified to be charged in the declared admission policy of the institution;
- viii. violation, by the institution, of any law for the time being in force in regard to reservation of seats in admission to different category of students;
- ix. non-payment or delay in payment of scholarships or financial aid admissible to any student under the declared admission policy of such institution, or under the conditions, if any, prescribed by the Commission;
- x. delay by the institution in the conduct of examinations, or declaration of results, beyond the schedule specified in the academic calendar of the institution,

or in such calendar prescribed by the Commission;

- xi. failure by the institution to provide student amenities as set out in the prospectus, or is required to be extended by the institution under any provisions of law for the time being in force;
- xii. non-transparent or unfair practices adopted by the institution for the evaluation of students;
- xiii. delay in, or denial of, the refund of fees due to a student who withdraws admission within the time mentioned in the prospectus, subject to guidelines, if any, issued by the Commission, from time to time;
- xiv. complaints of alleged discrimination of students from the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes, Other Backward Classes, Women, Minorities or persons with disabilities categories;
- xv. denial of quality education as promised at the time of admission or required to be provided;
- xvi. harassment or victimization of a student, other than cases of harassment, which are to be proceeded against under the penal provisions of any law for the time being in force;
- xvii. any action initiated/taken contrary to the statutes, ordinances, rules, regulations, or guidelines of the institution; and
- xviii. any action initiated/taken contrary to the regulations and/or guidelines made/issued by the Commission and/or the regulatory body concerned.

Code of Conduct for Students

Krishnagar Women's College, being the only College for women in the district, maintains a well-drafted code of conduct that aims to set parameters for academic excellence and fulfilling the stated mission and vision of the institution. It acts as a guide for the stakeholders, the students being one of the most important parts of the institution. Onceadmitted; the students are to follow the rules and regulations of the institution in order to maintain academic discipline inside the campus as well as outside

the campus. They become aware of what is expected of them and the Dos and Dont's as outlined by the institution.

- *Admitted students must abide by the University directive regarding attendance (more than 75%) in classes, failing which they will not be allowed to sit for Semester-end Examination.
- * Students must wear their Identity Cards issued by the College authority inside the College. Identity Cards are also required at the time of borrowing books from the library.
- *Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited in the College campus as well as in the Hostel.Anti-ragging Guidelines issued by UGC are enforced and it is mandatory that students sign and submit the Anti-Ragging Declaration Form at the beginning of the session. They can report any incident of ragging to the Anti-Ragging Cell of the College.
- *Students are not allowed to adopt any unfair means at the time of examination.
- * Students are not allowed to loiter in the corridors.
- * Use of Cell phones during class lectures and in the examination hall is strictly prohibited.
- *Students are expected to follow the College Notice Board as well as the College Website for notices and other academic information.
- *Students should stay away from any act of violence that may disrupt the conducive atmosphere of the College. They should take note that the College campus including the Hostel area is under CCTV surveillance.
- *Use of caste and religion-based discriminatory and derogatory remarks is an act of humiliation and indignity and it is strictly discouraged.
- * Participation in the various cultural and extension activities organized by the College is mandatory for the students.
- *It is expected of students that they should maintain a friendly relationship with their fellow students and behave respectfully with the Principal, teachers, librarians and non-teaching employees of the College.

Re-Enrolment in I to VI Semester Classes

If a student completes regular course of study for B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. Semester I to VI Honours & Programme/General examination, but for any reason fails to enroll himself/herself for the Semester I to VI examination, he/she shall be required to reenroll himself/herself in the said semester class respectively in the following session within 07 days from the last date of admission for regular students of that class. However, the permissible chance of such reenrollment shall be guided by clause 4.2 of the 'Examination regulation of the University. The college authorities must get such students enrolled for examination within two weeks of their re-enrolment in class.

Provisional Enrolment in II to VI Semester Classes

Candidates appearing at the end Semester examinations shall be enrolled provisionally for the next semester classes respectively within 07 days from the date of completion of the said examination, failing which such candidates shall not be enrolled on any subsequent dates and they shall be deemed to have discontinued study.

Admission on Transfer

If a student has been admitted to a college, he/she shall not, except as otherwise provided in the Ordinances, be subsequently admitted to any other college without the production of a Transfer Certificate from the Principal of the college in which he/she studied last.

A student admitted to a college, shall not ordinarily be allowed to take transfer to any other college, except at the end of a semester. If an application for transfer is made at any time, other than at the end of an academic year, on the ground of (a) transfer of the parent or guardian of the student from the station at which the college is situated, or (b) reasoned need for a change on the ground of health supported by proper medical evidence, or any other sufficient reason, the Principal may grant the transfer.

Admission on Transfer should abide by the following stipulations:

- (i) A candidate taking transfer from one college to another is required to pursue the same course of study with identical subject combination in both the colleges;
- (ii) Admission on transfer must not violate the approved intake of the course concerned of the college granting admission. Only in cases of wards of Government employees who have been transferred, a relaxation of intake may be granted with the permission of the Vice-Chancellor;
- (iii) Cases of admission on transfer must be intimated in writing to the University authority by the college admitting such candidates within a fortnight of such admission without which such admission on transfer will not be recognized;

All other steps and procedures related to transfer will be in accordance with the provisions of the Ordinances.

RULES FOR ADMISSION TO THE FOUR-YEAR (EIGHT SEMESTER) UG -COURSES WITH EFFECT FROM THE ACADEMIC SESSION 2023-2024 ONWARDS

This is to inform all concerned that for the purpose of admission in UG Courses for Academic Session 2023-2024 the Notifications No.: 266(31)-Edn[U]-EH/1U-45/2020(Pt.), Dated: 17.03.2023, No.: 339-Edn (CS)/OM74L/2023, Dated: 26.05.2023 and 354- Edn(CS)/10M-95/14, Dated: 02.06.2023 as issued by the Department of Higher Education, Government of West Bengal are to be strictly followed.

The Following guidelines for the Admission for Academic Session 2023-2024 shall be followed strictly.

2. Admission Qualifications:

Eligibility & Recognized Boards

A candidate may be admitted to the first semester of four-year [Eight Semester] UG-Courses of Studies on passing Higher Secondary (10+2) Examination in general conducted by the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education or an equivalent examination conducted by other State Board/Council, or The W.B. Council of Rabindra Open Schooling, or The National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS) recognized by the Distant Education Bureau(DEB) subject to fulfilment of the conditions mentioned below:

Candidates from 'other' Boards In case of other Boards/Councils, a candidate shall have to pass in five recognized subjects, of which one shall be English, of full marks not being less than 100 each. A candidate passing in less than five subjects shall not be eligible for admission.

Candidates from Vocational Stream	However, Candidates passing Higher Secondary examination in vocational stream conducted by the West Bengal State Council of Technical & Vocational Education & Skill Development (WBSCTVE&SD) or any other equivalent
	Board/Council are also eligible for admission provided that the candidate must have passed in 5 (five) recognized subjects, of which one shall be English.
***	Candidates shall be allowed for admission within 03 (three) consecutive academic sessions including the year of passing the previous qualifying examination. (For example: candidates passing H.S. Examination in the year 2021 will get last chance of admission in the academic session 2023-2024.)

3. Programmes of Study:

There shall be following one type of Under-Graduate Programme-

- 4-Year UG Degree (Honours / Honours with Research)
- As per the Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes, developed by the UGC there will be provisions for awarding UG Certificate, UG Diploma and Basic UG Degree with Major. Separate Rules/Guidelines will be framed in this regard.
- For 4 year UG Degree (Honours with Research), a student can choose a research stream in the fourth year, subject to fulfilment of all conditions; laid down by the UGC for implementation of NEP and Curriculum Credit Frame Work.

4 Minimum Eligibility Criteria for Admission :

- 4-Year UG Degree (Honours / Honours with Research): A student who has passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) Examination held by the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent Examination from other Boards / Councils with at least four subjects including English as Compulsory Subject of 100 marks is eligible to take admission to the UG-Courses of studies on the basis of merit and available vacancy of the particular subject(s) of the concerned college.
- (ii) Aggregate marks shall be calculated by adding the marks in top-four subjects, in order of marks secured by a candidate, Marks obtained in Compulsory Environmental Studies (if any) shall not be taken into account for calculation of aggregate marks.
- (iii) A candidate shall be allowed to pursue any one of the Programmes in a particular Academic Session. At the initial stage, every student has to choose one Major subject and two Minor subjects.

Special conditions for admission to a few Major/ Minor Courses

- 6. Some special conditions for admission to UG Courses in Accounting and Finance, Chemistry, Economics, Education, Environmental Science, Mathematics, Media Studies Microbiology, Molecular Biology, Molecular Biology & Biotechnology, Physiology, Philosophy, and Sociology:
- (i) Accounting and Finance: For admission to the UG [Commerce] course in Accounting & Finance the word "subject" or "related subject" shall mean the following:

Accountancy, Book Keeping, Business Economics including Business Mathematics, Business Mathematics, Business Organization, Business Studies, Commerce, Economics, Economic Geography, Elements of Cost Accountancy & Auditing, Financial Accounting, Mathematics, Office Practice & Secretarial and Statistics.

- (ii) Chemistry: A candidate shall be allowed to take up Major/Minor in Chemistry only if he/she has passed in Chemistry, Physics and Mathematics at the previous qualifying examination.
- (iii) Economics: The subjects Mathematics, Statistics and Business Economics including Business Mathematics be treated as related subjects.

(iv)Education: The subjects History, Philosophy, Political Science, Psychology and Sociology be treated as related subjects.

(v) Environmental Science: If the candidate does not have Environmental Education/Environmental Science/ Environmental Studies as elective subject then the subjects Biological Sciences, Chemistry, Computer Science, Economics, Geography, Geology, Mathematics, Modern Computer Application, Physics and Statistics be treated as related subjects.

(vi)Food and Nutrition: A candidate taking up Major/Minor in Food and Nutrition must take Chemistry as general subject.

(vii) Mathematics: A candidate shall be allowed to take up Major/Minor in Mathematics only if he/she has passed in Mathematics in the previous qualifying examination. A candidate who has passed in Business Mathematics is not eligible for admission to Mathematics Major Course.

(viii) Media Studies: The language subject(s) studied at H.S. level be treated as related subject(s).

(ix)Microbiology: A candidate taking up Major in Microbiology must take Chemistry or anyone of the following subjects: a) Botany, b) Computer Science, c) Mathematics, d) Physics, e) Physiology, f) Zoology as Minor subjects.

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- (x) Molecular Biology: A candidate shall be allowed to take up Major in Molecular Biology only if he/she has passed in Biological Sciences, Chemistry or any one of the following subjects: a)Mathematics, b) Statistics, c) Computer Science at the previous qualifying examination.
- (xi)Molecular Biology & Biotechnology: A candidate taking up Major in Molecular Biology & Biotechnology must take Chemistry or any one of the following subjects: a) Botany, b)Computer Science, c) Mathematics, d) Physics, e) Physiology, f) Zoology as Minor subjects.
- (xii) Philosophy: The subject Psychology be treated as related subject.
- (xiii) Physiology: A candidate shall be allowed to take up Major in Physiology only if he/she has passed in Biological Sciences and Chemistry at the previous qualifying examination.

(xiv) Sociology: The subjects History, Philosophy, Political Science & Psychology be treated as related subjects.

7. Intake Capacity and Reservation of Seats:

The intake capacity for each programme will be as follows:

- 4-Year UG Degree (Honours / Honours with Research): The existing intake capacity in
 honours subject as approved by the University shall be considered as the intake
 capacity for 4-Year UG Degree (Honours / Honours with Research). In addition to that,
 maximum 25% of the total intake of programme course of the same division (B.A or
 B.Sc. or B.Com.) of that college will be included in the major course of a particular
 subject of that division. However, the intake capacity will be increased as per the
 provisions of Gazette Notification no, 339-Edn (CS)/OM-74L/2023 dated 26.05.23.
- Colleges will develop necessary mechanism to restrict the number of students admitted in a particular major/minor subject.
- Reservation of seats: There shall be reservation of seats for SC / ST / OBC-A /OBC-B/ EWS and Differently-abled Candidates as per Rules/Orders of the State Government.
- The intake capacity as approved by the University should be compulsorily maintained.

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8. Groups of Disciplines / Subjects:

A candidate is required to choose not more than one discipline/subject (Minor) from any of the groups mentioned below.

- All the Undergraduate students of the University have to register themselves for Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) through http://www.abc.gov.in/.
- 10. The Controller of Examinations, University of Kalyani has issued the course structures (Semester-I to Semester-VIII) following the guidelines of NEP-2020 to the concerned colleges for the Academic Session 2023-2024 onwards. All the course structures and the detailed Examination Regulations (to be published shortly) shall be followed strictly.
- 11. Undergraduate Degree Programmes of 4-year duration, with multiple entry and exit points and re-entry options, with appropriate certifications will be provided such as:
- * a UG certificate after completing 1 year (2 Semesters) of study in the chosen fields of study, provided that a skill based vocational course (additional 4 credits) must be completed during the summer term by the students who will exit the programme after securing 40 credits. These students are allowed to re-enter the degree programme within three years and complete the degree programme within the stipulated maximum period of seven (7) years.
- A UG Diploma after 2 years (4 Semesters) of study, provided that a skill based vocational course (additional 4 credits) must be completed during the summer term by the students who will exit the programme after securing 80 credits. These students are allowed to re-enter the degree programme within three years and complete the degree programme within the stipulated maximum period of seven (7) years.

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- A Bachelor's Degree with Major shall be given after completing 3-year (6 Semesters) programme of study.
- * A Bachelor's Degree (Honours) shall be given after completing 4 year (8 Semester) programme of study. If the students complete a rigorous research project/dissertation in their major area(s) study in the 4th year of a bachelor's degree then he/she will be given Honours with Research degree.
- 12. The Under Graduate Colleges having the affiliation for Honours (Major) Course(s) are entitled to the affiliation for introducing Minor Course(s) in the same subject(s), subject to the approval of appropriate authority. In that case, the approval / post facto approval for intake capacity is to be taken from the University.

Similarly, the Under Graduate Colleges having the affiliation for General (Minor) Course(s) are entitled to the affiliation for introducing Major Course(s) in the same subject(s), except Physical Education, Defence Studies and Film Studies, subject to the approval of appropriate authority. In that case, the approval / post facto approval for intake capacity is to be taken from the University.

13. All testimonials are required to be uploaded online during application. Verification of documents will be done by the respective college authorities only when the students will report for classes in due course. Admission will be cancelled if the documents are found not in conformity with the declaration in the forms submitted online.
