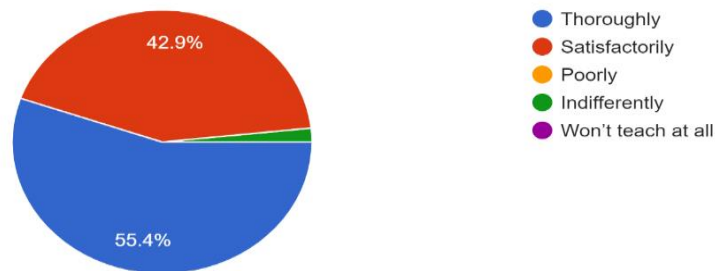


Students Satisfaction Survey_2022-23 Krishnagar Women's College

For the AQAR (2022-23), Students Satisfaction Survey (SSS) was conducted among the students of the college 2022-23 final year student. The questionnaire has been framed based on NAAC guidelines. We have received 177 responses from our students. The summary is presented in the form of pie chart.

1. How much of the syllabus was covered in the class?

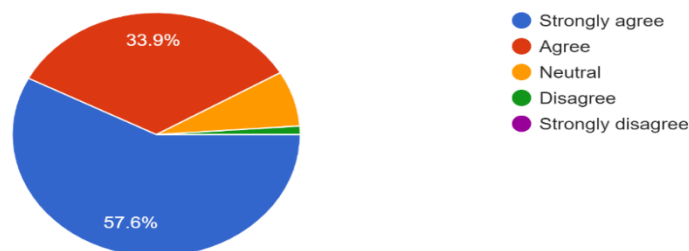
177 responses



Observation: The above Pie Chart designs on the completion of the syllabus. Out of a total of 177 students, a large share of the students (i.e., 55.4%) responded that syllabus was completed thoroughly on time. 42.9% of students responded that the syllabus was completed satisfactorily. Only a few students responded that syllabus was completed indifferently. So, a maximum number of students are satisfied with the teaching activities.

2. The institution makes effort to engage students in the monitoring, review and continuous quality improvement of the teaching learning process.

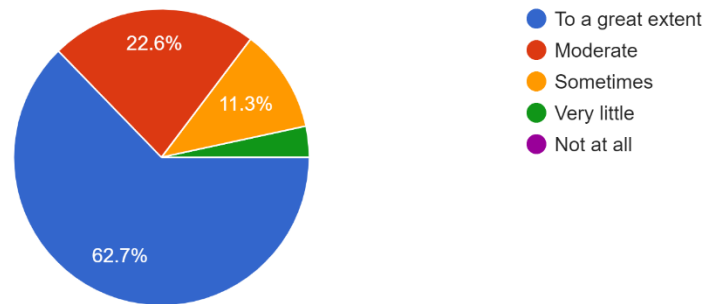


Observation: This is a comparative analysis of the student's views about the institution's effort to engage students in the monitoring, review and continuous quality improvement on the teaching learning process. The graphic result shows that 57.6% of the students have responded with their strongly agree. 33.9% of students have responded that they are agree that the institution makes effort to engage students in the monitoring, review and continuous quality improvement on the teaching learning

process. However, only a few students remained neutral in their points and only a very few students responded their disagreement.

3. The institution/teachers use student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies for enhancing learning experiences.

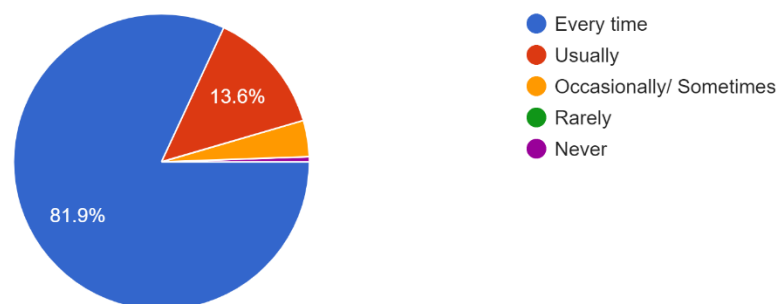

Observation: The above Pie Chart designs a result on students' feedback on the institution/teachers use student centric methods in teaching learning process. Out of a total of 177 students, a large share of the students (i.e., 62.7%) responded with that the institution/teachers use student centric methods in teaching learning process is fulfilled in a great extent, and 22.6% responded with moderate. 11.3% of students responded that they believe that the institution/teachers use student centric methods in teaching learning process had been fulfilled sometimes. So, a maximum number of students are satisfied with the institution/teachers use student centric methods in teaching learning process.

4. Teachers encourage you to participate in extracurricular activities

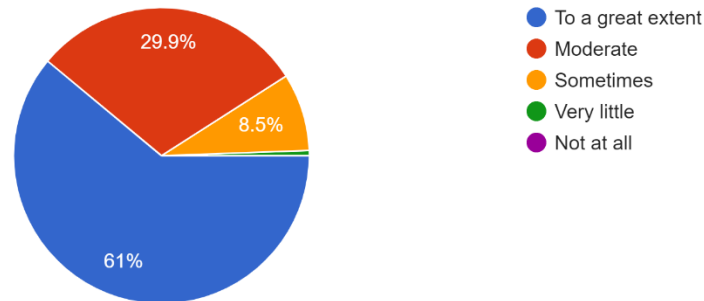
177 responses



Observation: The graphic result shows that 81.9% of students agreed that teachers always encourage them to participate in extracurricular activities. Though 13.6% of students responded that teachers encourage them to participate in extracurricular activities usually, and a very few responded with occasionally/sometimes.

5. Efforts are made by the institute/ teachers to inculcate soft skills, life skills and employability skills to make you ready for the world of work.

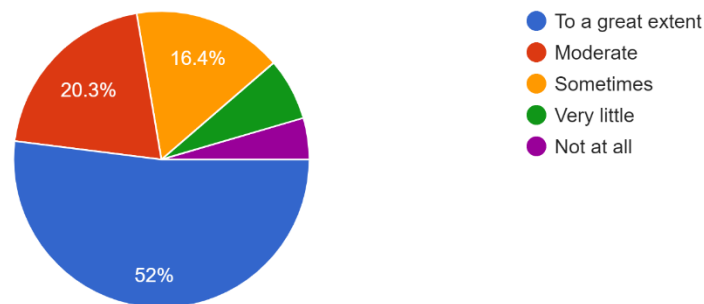

Observation: The Chart result shows that 61% of students responded that in to a great extent they believe that the institution/teachers make effort to inculcate soft skills and employability skills to make them ready for the world of work. 29.9% responded it as moderate, and 8.5% responded as sometimes. Though very few students responded it as very little.

6. Percentage of teachers use ICT tools such as LCD projector, Multimedia, etc. While teaching.

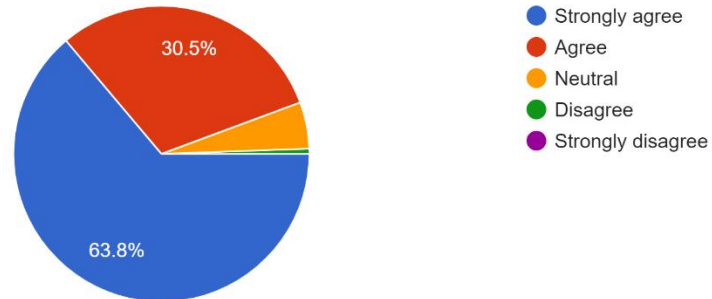

Observation: The result appears that 52% of students responded their views that to a great extent teachers use ICT tools while teaching. However, 20.3% and 16.4% of students responded it as moderate and sometimes respectively. Only a few students responded it as very little and not at all.

7. The overall quality of teaching-learning process in your institute is very good.

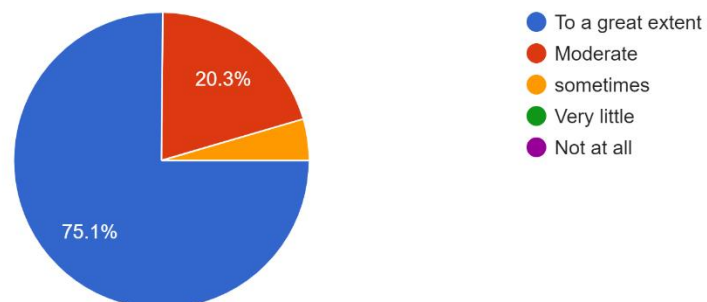

8. Academic Environment of the College

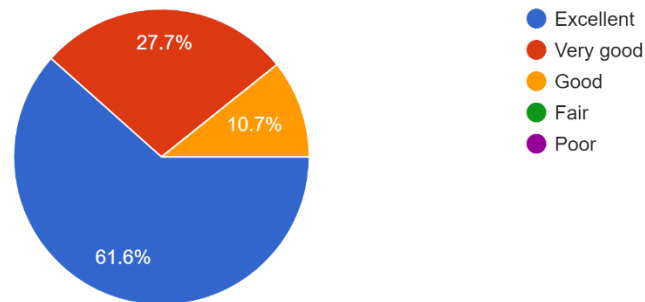

9. How well did the teachers prepare for the classes?

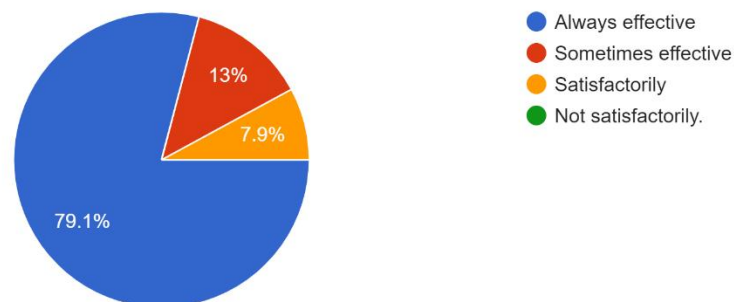

10. How well were the teachers able to communicate?

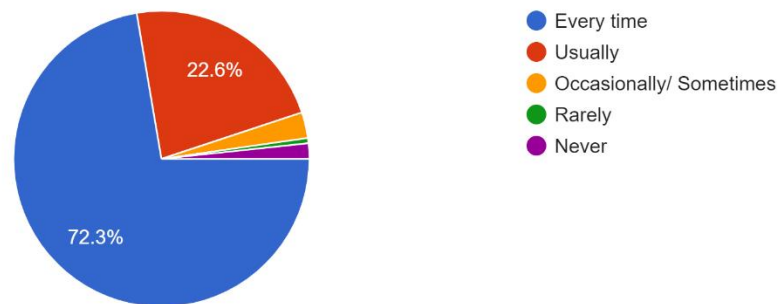

11. Teachers are able to identify your weaknesses and help you to overcome them.

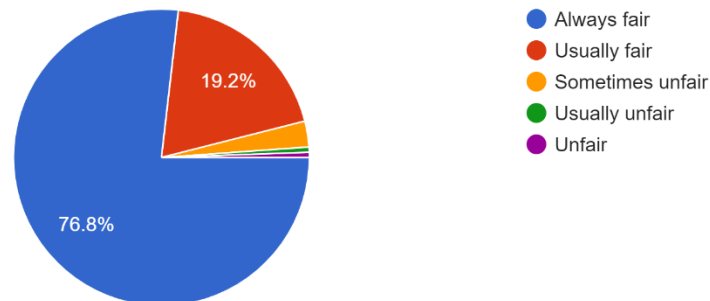
177 responses

12. Fairness of the internal evaluation process by the teachers

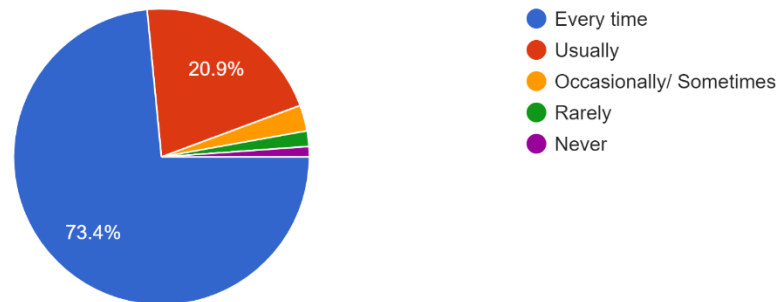
177 responses



Observation: The result shows that 76.8% of students believe teachers always do fair in evaluating process of internal exams. 19.2% of students responded it as usually fair. However, only a few students it as usually unfair or unfair.

13. Was your performance in assignments discussed with you?

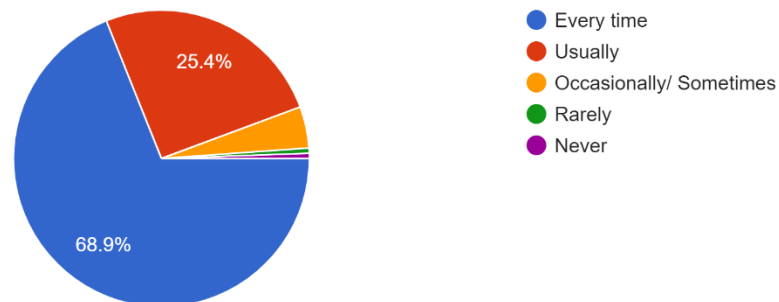

Observation: The result shows that 73.4% of students agreed that every time teachers discuss students' performance in assignment with them. 20.9% of students responded it as usually. However, only a few students found teachers' discussion on students' performance in assignment with them as rarely, and never.

14. Your mentor does a necessary follow-up with an assigned task to you.

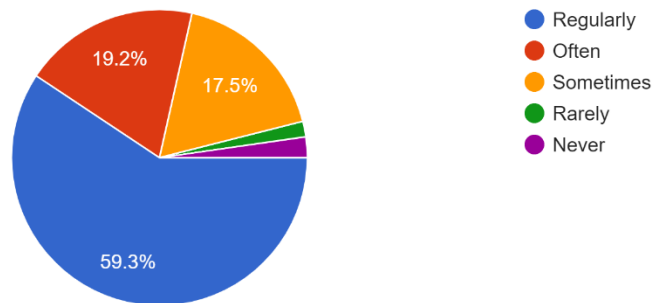
177 responses



Observation: The result shows that 68.9% of students agreed that every time mentor does a necessary follow-up with assign task with them. 25.4% of students responded it as usually. However, only a few students found it as rarely, and never.

15. The institute takes active interest in promoting internship, student exchange, field visit opportunities for students.

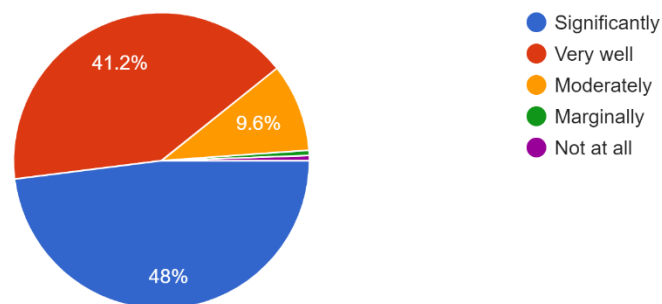
177 responses

16. The teaching and mentoring process in your institution facilitates you in cognitive, social and emotional growth.

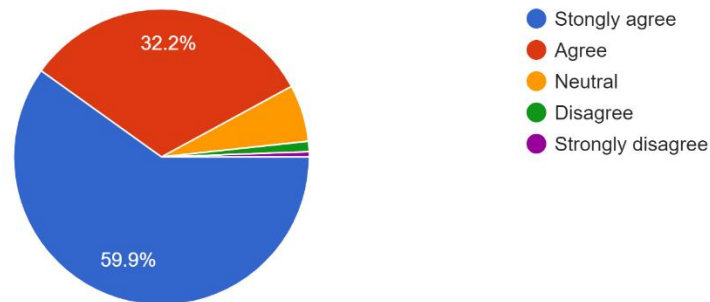
177 responses

17. The institution provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow.

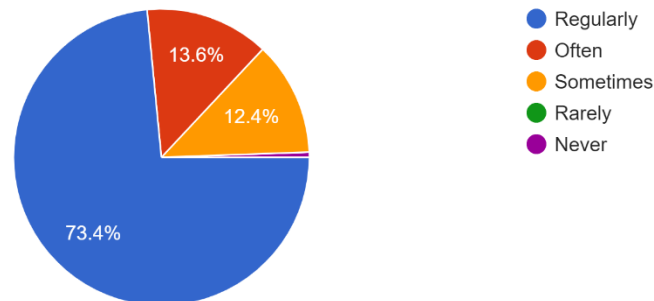

18. Teachers inform you about your expected competencies, course outcomes and programme outcomes.

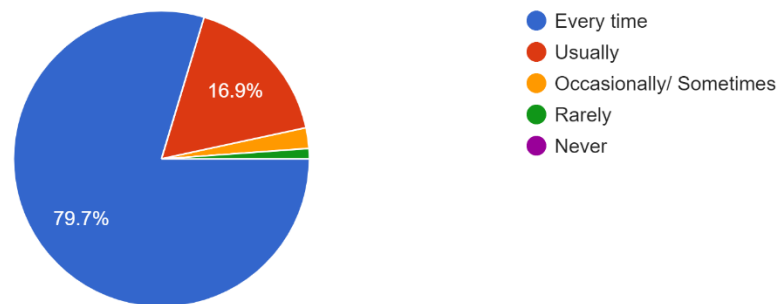
177 responses

19. The teachers illustrate the concepts through examples and applications.

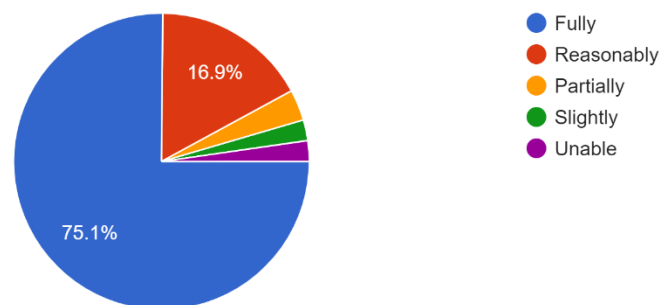
