






Analysis 2. Attendance Pattern




Analysis 3. Syllabus Coverage

Analysis 4. Academic Support from Teachers




Analysis 5. Teachers' Effort to Identify and Overcome Weaknesses














Analysis 11. Library Reading Room Spaciousness



Analysis 13. Laboratory Facilities (Science Students)






Analysis 14. Helpfulness of Office Staff




Analysis 15. Common Room Facilities




Analysis 16. Fitness Centre




Analysis 17. Canteen Facilities


Analysis 18. Cleanliness of Toilets




Analysis 20. Playground Maintenance

Analysis 21. Information about Scholarships








The Teacher Feedback Report for Krishnagar Women's College provides an analytical overview of the responses received from teachers regarding the effectiveness of the new curriculum framework of newly introduced NEP 2020 syllabus. The feedback was collected to evaluate the teaching methodologies, course delivery etc. The feedback was taken through google form

A total of 34 teachers were participated in the feedback process, out of which 33 teacher responded, resulting in an impressive response rate of 97%. This high level of participation reflects the teachers' active engagement and willingness to contribute towards enhancing the academic environment of the college.

The feedback is structured around a standardized five-point scale. The insights gathered will be instrumental in identifying strengths and areas for improvement, fostering a culture of continuous development and academic excellence.

1.Current syllabus of NEP 2020 is updated, need based and suitable for both slow and advanced learners.




Analysis:

A majority (63.6%) rated the syllabus as “Excellent” or “Very Good.” However, a small percentage (9.1%) found it “Average” or “Poor,” indicating room for improvement in addressing the needs of diverse learners.




Analysis:




Analysis:




Analysis:




Analysis:




Analysis:




Analysis:

33 responses




Analysis:




Analysis:

- Further emphasis on experiential learning and modern techniques is needed.


3. Recommendations:


Alumni Feedback Analysis Report 2023-24



Insight: This indicates a strong appreciation for the teaching methodologies employed by the college.





Insight: The assessment methods are motivating for most, though there is scope for improvement to cater to the needs of a





Insight: The college has succeeded in creating a conducive environment for learning.




Analysis 4: 119 respondents found the teachers' support and competence Excellent, and 62 rated it as Very Good.

Insight: The faculty is a key strength of the college, as perceived by the alumni.





Insight: While appreciated by many, there is room for improvement in infrastructure and lab facilities.




Analysis 6: 86 respondents rated extracurricular activities as Excellent, followed by 56 as Very Good. However, 14 respondents found them Average.

Insight: Alumni recognize the role of extracurricular activities in personality development but suggest further enhancements.




Analysis 7: 95 respondents found the library facilities Excellent, 60 rated them as Very Good, and 41 as Good.

Insight: The library is seen as a valuable resource, with potential for modernization or expansion.




Analysis 8: A majority (121) rated discipline as Excellent, and 63 rated it Very Good. There were no Poor or Average ratings.

- ❖ Regular Alumni



Parents Feedback Analysis Report 2023-24



Admission Process:




All parents unanimously agreed (86 strongly agree) that the admission process is fair and accurate, indicating high satisfaction.




78 parents strongly agreed that getting admission for their daughters is a matter of pride, showcasing the college's reputation.

84 parents (strongly agree: 71, agree: 13) expressed satisfaction with the quality of teaching. This reflects positively on the professors' efforts.




Knowledge Improvement:




86 parents observed their ward's knowledge enhancement through interaction with faculty, with 69 strongly agreeing to this statement.

Examination System:




A large majority (85 respondents) expressed satisfaction with the examination system, affirming its robustness and transparency.

Discipline:




84 parents (74 strongly agree, 10 agree) were satisfied with the college's discipline, highlighting a safe and orderly environment.

Library Facilities:





Behavioural Changes:




76 parents observed a positive behavioural change in their wards, though 10 parents were neutral, suggesting potential areas for improvement in personality development programs.


Employability Focus:




