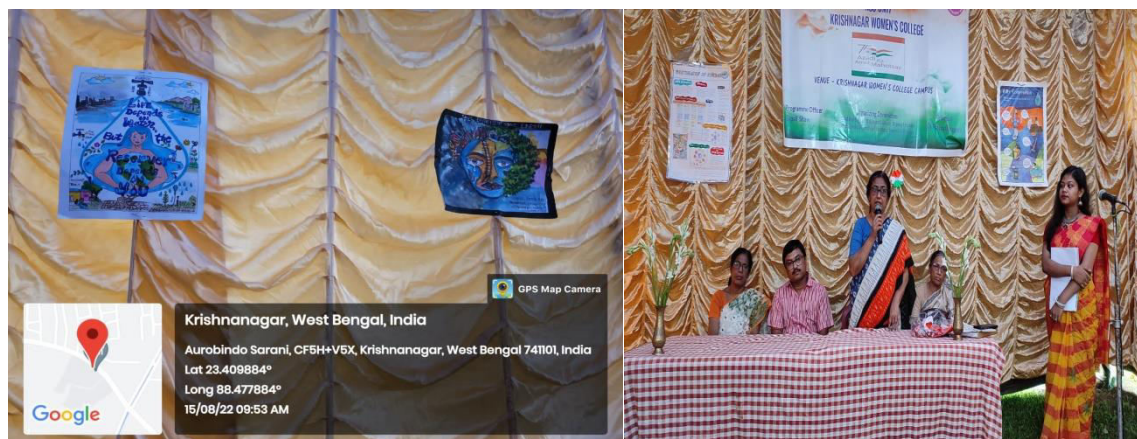
## World Environmental Day on 5th June 2022

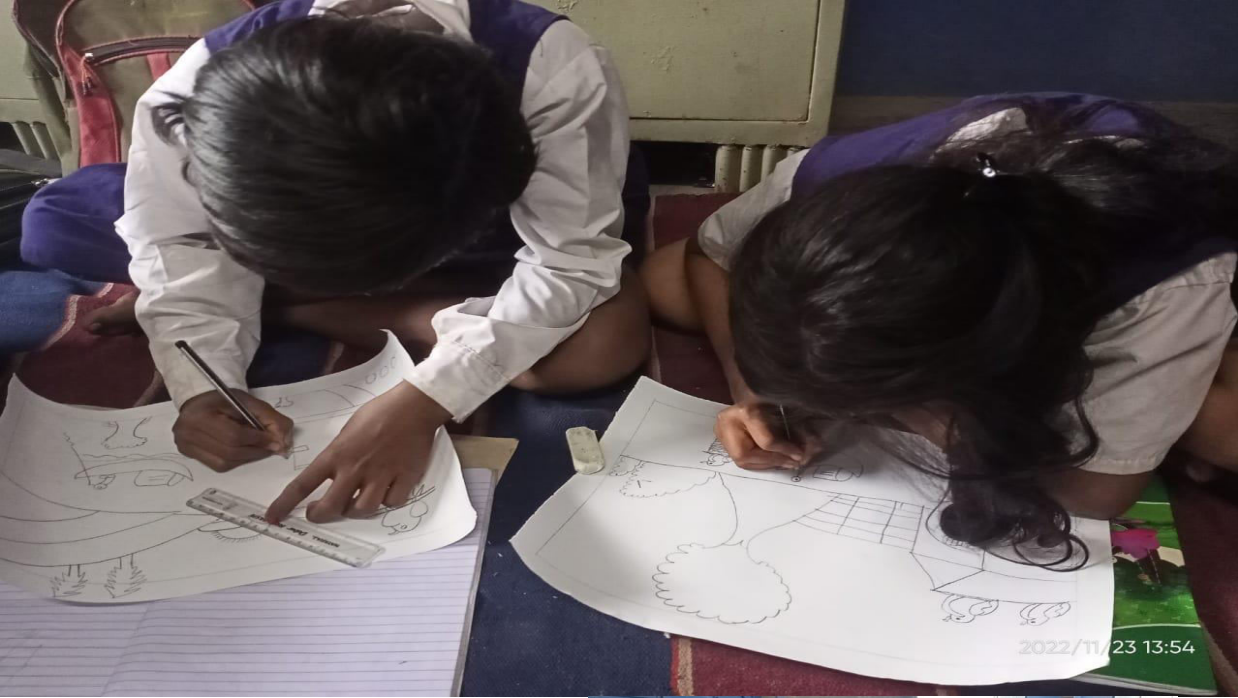

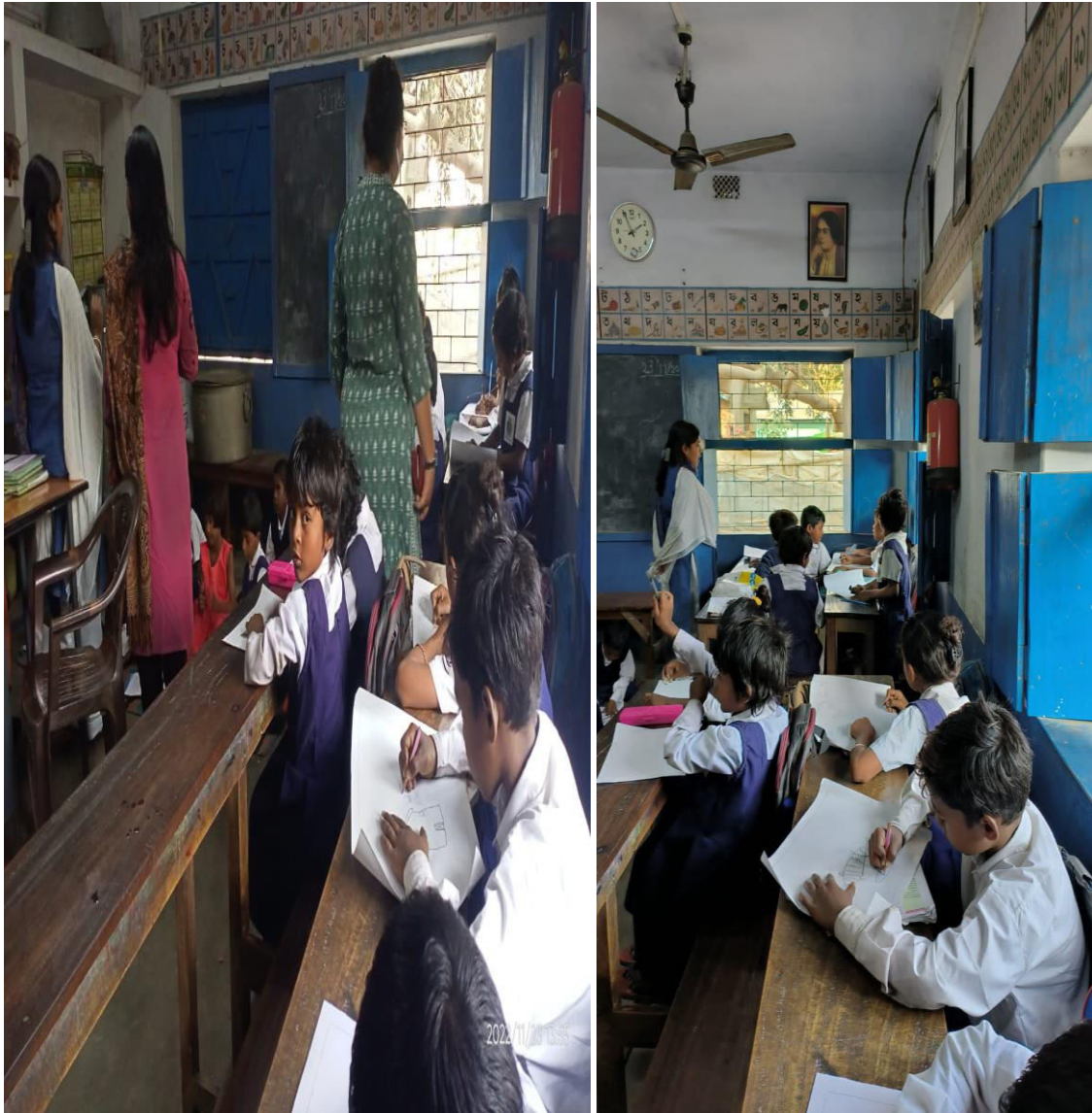






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## **Campus Cleaning and Electricity Conservation Awareness Drive : 2<sup>nd</sup> January,2023**

### **Awareness programme on human trafficking and cross Border trafficking: 6<sup>th</sup> January,2023**

On 6th January 2023, the NSS Unit of Krishnagar Women's College organized an awareness program on human trafficking and cross-border trafficking. The event took place at the Bina Das Memorial Hall of the college and aimed to educate the participants about the grave issue of trafficking and raise awareness about its various

dimensions. The guest speaker for the event was Priyanka Malita, the Superintendent of Police of Krishnagar.

**Objectives:** The main objectives of the awareness program were as follows: a) Educate participants about the nature and scope of human trafficking and cross-border trafficking. b) Create awareness about the methods used by traffickers and the vulnerabilities of potential victims. c) Inform participants about the legal frameworks and initiatives in place to combat trafficking. d) Empower participants to recognize and report instances of trafficking. e) Encourage the community to come together and take preventive measures against trafficking.

- e) **Identifying and Reporting Trafficking:** The guest speaker emphasized the importance of recognizing signs of trafficking and shared indicators that could help identify potential victims. She urged participants to report any suspicious activities or cases to the appropriate authorities promptly.

**Interactive Session:** Following the presentation, an interactive session was conducted to address questions, concerns, and provide clarifications. Participants actively



engaged in discussions, seeking advice on various aspects related to human trafficking and cross-border trafficking.

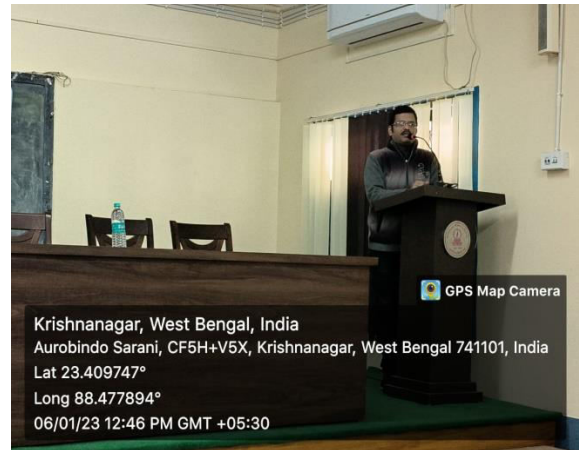

(ii) To provide opportunities for students to play their due roles in the implementation of various development “programmes by planning and executing development projects, which not only help in creating durable community assets in rural areas but also result in the improvement of the condition of weaker sections of the communities.

(iii) Encouraging the students and non-student youth to work along with the adults in rural areas, thereby developing their character, social consciousness and commitment, discipline and healthy and helpful attitudes towards the community.

### **ACTIVITY:**

**On the first day**, we the NSS team member visited Nicherpara Primary School and the student as well as teachers wholeheartedly welcome us. We gave them brief details about our camp and the objective of our visit. They were highly interested. Teachers happily permitted us to have their students for participating in our camp. We also assured the teacher that we will not hamper any teaching-learning process in the school. This is how the day 1 activity ended on a very positive note.
