Movie Screening: “Bhopal: A Prayer for Rain”

The movie, directed by **Ravi Kumar**, is based on the **Bhopal Gas Tragedy (1984)**—one of the deadliest industrial disasters in history. It portrays the sequence of events leading up to the **leakage of toxic methyl isocyanate (MIC) gas** from the **Union Carbide** pesticide plant in **Bhopal, India**, which resulted in thousands of deaths and long-term environmental contamination.

Through **powerful storytelling and real-life accounts**, the film raises awareness about:

- **Corporate accountability and ethical responsibility** in industrial operations.
- **Environmental laws and the importance of strict regulations** to prevent disasters.
- **The devastating impact of pollution** on human health and ecosystems.
- **The necessity of public awareness and disaster preparedness** to mitigate risks.

A **video illustration of the movie** was presented by **Sri Sajal Biswas**, providing an overview of the tragic events and their lasting consequences.





Explanations and Feedback
